I have listed some of the planned events for the LCP visit to Hawaii.

- 1.) The Honorable Mayor Oscar Rodrigues, President of the League of Cities of the Philippines (LCP) or the Honorable Mayor Hernani Braganza, Secretary General (LCP) will address the Hawaii State Legislature with a message from the President of the Republic of the Philippines regarding goals to strengthen the relationship between Hawaii and the Republic of the Philippines and working together to encourage business opportunities between Hawaii and the Philippines.
- 2.) We have confirmed that the Governor of the State of Hawaii will come down to address the League of Cities of the Philippines, consisting of all mayors from urban areas of the Republic of the Philippines, on their President's message and their request to build a stronger relationship between Hawaii and the Republic of the Philippines.
- 3.) We have confirmed that all four Hawaii county Mayors will attend this floor session.
- 4.) We have confirmed that the Governor of the state of Hawaii, along with the House of Representatives and the four county Mayors will co-host the reception to celebrate the signing of the "Memorandum of Understanding" between the state of Hawaii and the Republic of the Philippines on March 1, 2012 from 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. at Washington Place.
- 5.) The House membership will have the opportunity to recognize the LCP Mayors, to approve passage of HCR3 and HR21 on the Memorandum of Understanding and to congratulate the LCP Mayors. To date, 21 mayors have confirmed their attendance along with 20 council members from the Republic of the Philippines.
- 6.) Hawaii's four county mayors will be seated on the floor with the twenty one (21) mayors from the Philippines.

We are writing to personally invite you and your staff to the 26th Hawaii State Legislature to attend the upcoming League of Cities of the Philippines Conference to be held in Hawaii from February 27, 2012 - March 7, 2012.

The State of Hawaii shares common goals with the Philippines in fostering strong and effective local governments, promoting and maintaining friendships, as well as learning and sharing social and economic opportunities that benefit cities in the Philippines and Hawaii.



 - Coordinate with UNISDR for possible joint activity

- Scout for possible Filipino entertainers that may be brought to Hawaii for events with Filipino communities (look for sponsors)

4. Hawaii To-Dos

- Coordinate with LCP for required letters for US Visa processing
- Coordinate with LCP for possible Hawaii accommodations for LCP (if possible, near the state legislature)
- Facilitate LCP's contact with Hawaii Filipino community representatives (government and associations)
- Coordinate with Hawaii Filipino communities for community sponsored events
- Arrange courtesy visits in government and educational institutions
- Arrange and coordinate for Knowledge Sharing activities
- Arrange sisterhood signing requirements

Recognizing the requirements of our timeline, LCP will try to submit at the soonest possible time, the potential list of mayors (and support staff) that will be making the trip. We will also furnish as soon as possible the US Visa requirements of mayors and support staff.

THE STATE OF HAWAII, with address at _____, Hawaii, represented herein by its _____, Hon. _____, and hereinafter referred to as the "STATE OF HAWAII"

LEAGUE OF CITIES OF THE PHILIPPINES, a non-stock, non-profit corporation organized and existing under Philippine law through Section 499 of Republic Act No. 7160 or the Local Government Code of the Philippines, with principal office at Units J&K, 7th floor, CyberOne Building, Eastwood, Libis, Quezon City 1610, represented herein by its President. **HON. OSCAR S. RODRIGUEZ**; hereinafter referred to as the "LCP".

WITNESSETH, that - -

WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii is seeking to expand its international ties and has interest in developing goodwill, friendship, and economic relations between the people of Hawaii and the people of the Philippines;

WHEREAS, the League of Cities of the Philippines, as the mandated local government association representing Philippine Cities. is also seeking opportunities for cooperation in the fields of economy, trade, culture, education, health, tourism and environmental protection to benefit the economic and social development of Philippine Cities;

WHEREAS, the Legislature of the State of Hawaii has passed significant laws on matters which are also the main concerns of the member cities of the LCP such as land use, conservation of environment and natural resources, alternative and renewable sources of energy, water and sewerage management, juvenile justice system, educational system, public health, mass transport, housing, and tourism;

WHEREAS, there is a substantial number of Filipinos and former Filipinos who are residents and citizens of the State of Hawaii, occupy very significant and sensitive government positions both in the Executive and Legislative Departments, and who contribute significantly to the prosperity and development of the State;

WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii and the LCP share the common goal of fostering strong and effective local governments and the principles of developing camaraderie and sharing of knowledge, and capacities among local governments of different countries;

WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii and the LCP recognize the rich historical relationship between the United States and the Republic of the Philippines and there continue to exist valid reasons to promote international friendship and understanding for the mutual benefit of both countries to achieve lasting peace and prosperity;

WHEREAS, there is a common desire to maintain a close cultural, commercial, and financial bridge between ethnic Filipinos living in Hawaii with their relatives, friends, and business counterparts living in Philippine Cities;

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the foregoing, the parties hereto have hereunto entered into this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to represent the commitment of the State of Hawaii and the LCP to work together to achieve the benefits of cooperation in pursuing the objectives of this MOU.

I. PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVES:

The purpose of this Memorandum is to strengthen political, social and economic cooperation between the State of Hawaii and the LCP, and, to this end, both shall contribute to the fulfilment of the following objectives:

1. To carry out joint programmes and projects that may contribute to improving the quality of life of the people of the State of Hawaii and of the member cities of the LCP;

2. To increase the exchange of knowledge, information, experiences and best practices that can contribute to the economic and social development of the State of Hawaii and the member cities of the LCP and their people;

3. To foster peace and goodwill between the people of Hawaii and Philippine Cities; and

4. To promote understanding of culture through education, exchange and programs.

II. ACTIVITIES:

Activities to be undertaken under this MOU may include:

1. Exchange visits by the citizens of both the State of Hawaii and the Philippine Cities;

2. Official visits between representatives from both the State of Hawaii and the members cities of the LCP.

3. Cultural exchanges and exchange of various information and materials towards the development of mutual understanding between citizens of both the State of Hawaii and the Philippine Cities;

4. Sourcing and sharing of information and best practices in the fields of economy, trade, culture, education, health, tourism, urban land use, alternative sources of energy, mass transport, water and sewerage management, and environmental protection;

5. Sharing of technical experts for policy and program development on identified issues common to both the State of Hawaii and the LCP

III. IMPLEMENTATION:

The State of Hawaii and the LCP will create a Working Group to advance the objectives stated in this agreement. The Working Group shall work on the details for the implementation of this MOU.

The Working Group will coordinate from time to time, meet to review the joint initiatives, and to assess the general progress on the goals and objectives stated herein the MOU. Both will agree on cost mechanisms that will support the implementation of the MOU as maybe prescribed in the agreed workplan.
