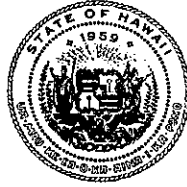

1 **Department's Position:** We respectfully oppose the bill's amendments of Chapter 328.

2 **Fiscal Implications:** Increasing the number of items regulated as this bill does, implies a need for more
3 enforcement staff.

4 **Purpose and Justification:** This bill proposes amendments to the Hawaii Revised Statutes Chapter 328
5 which will add two new sections and will add previously frozen bread to a number of food items
6 regulated by the Department without increasing the number of enforcement personnel. The bill is
7 unnecessary from a health view point.

8 As to health in general, appropriate labeling can help to verify the identity and composition of a
9 food in instances when the food may be implicated in a foodborne illness. Uncooked food that was
10 previously frozen and not thawed properly may contribute to a foodborne illness. However, from a
11 health stand point, we do not see a need to label thawed bread products "previously frozen". The
12 proposed language to include "previously frozen, sliced, sandwich-style bread" is not applicable since
13 §328-61 'Notifying consumer' refers to the sale of uncooked, thawed food.

14 The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) 21 CFR 101.95 defines the term "fresh", when
15 used on the label or in labeling of a food in a manner that suggests or implies that the food is

1 unprocessed, means that the food is in its raw state and has not been frozen or subjected to any form of
2 thermal processing or any other form of preservation. The Department can remove previously frozen
3 bread products from sale that contain the term “fresh”, since the bread would be considered misbranded.

4 The Department appreciates your interest in protecting consumers. However, with present
5 funding and manpower we must focus our resources on higher risk areas of food safety that can injure
6 the public’s health. The time and effort involved in determining labeling compliance for previously
7 frozen bread products that are sold thawed would place a significant burden on the Food and Drug
8 Branch staff and would detract us from our health focus. Even if new and additional resources were
9 received, they would be better spent focusing on the prevention of more significant health threats.
10 However, such increases are not part of the executive biennium budget. The health and well being of
11 the public will be better served if our time and effort remains focused on more significant health issues
12 such as responding to recalls, conducting food inspections, and removing adulterated and/or misbranded
13 products from sale.

I support S.B. 1086, SD1, which will require companies selling previously frozen sliced, sandwich-style bread to mark their packaging with the words “previously frozen.”

I am a consumer. I have to admit that I look at price when I shop for anything. A few years ago, I saw Cascade Pride bread on sale at Longs. It was on sale for a very good price so I bought it. To my disappointment, the bread was dry and didn't have much taste. Worse yet, it mildewed before the week was up. At the time, I had no idea that the bread was “previously frozen.” Had I known that, I might not have purchased the bread at all, despite the low price.

Consumers want to know what they're buying. If bread was frozen then thawed out in the back of a store then put on the store shelf, the consumer should know this. If he or she wants to buy the bread even after knowing that it had been frozen, that is the consumer's decision. With the facts, the consumer can make an informed choice.

This bill will provide the consumer with the fact that bread has been previously frozen. It's similar to letting the consumer know that fish has been previously frozen or eggs are from the mainland. The consumer may still buy the previously frozen fish or bread or mainland eggs, probably because of the price, but that will be the consumer's choice.

Please help consumers get the information we need to make our choice and pass S.B. 1086, SD1. Thank you for considering my testimony.

I am writing in support of S.B. 1086, SD1, which will require a label to identify sliced, sandwich-style bread that is “previously frozen.”

The loaves of sliced bread on the store shelves look the same so I always assumed they were all fresh baked. But I just found out that half of the bread sold is “previously frozen.” That means it was probably baked on the mainland, frozen before being shipped here, then allowed to thaw out before being sold.

As a consumer, I'd like to know if my bread was “previously frozen.” This information will help me decide whether to buy the bread or not and, if I do, how long it will keep and whether I can freeze it again. Consumers should be given information we need to make an **informed choice**. *As with meats sold in the markets label “previously frozen”, all I ask is that the same considerate information be given to me as a consumer when it comes to the purchase of bread.*

I also support this bill because it supports local companies that provide good jobs to Hawaii residents. As much as possible, we should buy local so that people in Hawaii can support themselves, their families, and our local economy. *By supporting local companies, it helps insure our Hawaiian industries remain viable and strong.*

I am writing in support of S.B. 1086, SD1, which will require a label to identify sliced, sandwich-style bread that is "previously frozen."

As a union representative I have witnessed the demise of local industries like our fresh milk dairies and egg farms. Since the closure of Hawaii Baking Company, our state's surviving fresh bread bakery, Love's Bakery, has had to unfairly compete against frozen mainland bread marketed deliberately side-by-side with its fresh baked bread.

S. B. 1086 is a consumer friendly bill that will let the public know if bread was "previously frozen." This information is being strongly opposed by the frozen mainland bread distributors for one reason - PROFITS.

Consumers should have the right to make an informed decision whether to buy locally baked fresh bread or frozen mainland bread. However, the distributors of frozen mainland bread have gone to great lengths to conceal the difference between fresh and frozen bread. The Hawaii Food Alliance even packages frozen mainland bread in its own bread bags to give the appearance that it's a local product.

I also support S.B. 1086 because it will provide good jobs to Hawaii residents, which helps sustain Hawaii. The frozen mainland bread distributors sees locally baked fresh bread as a commodity that needs to be eliminate from our store shelves. Please don't let big business decide whether we should only consume frozen mainland bread, let the public decide by passing S.B. 1086.
