An amazing historical movie entitled *Mana Waka*, I remember watching while living on Lana'i over 20 years ago at the (then) Lana'i Community Center. This film was commissioned by the Princess Te Puea Herangi of the Maori to be shared around the Pacific. It was filmed in black and white during 1937, depicting the process of selecting trees to build ocean going wa'a from the mountainous forests of Aotearoa. The story within, was a brilliant account of how the Maori revered our maker for providing the forest and the pains taking steps they took to carefully select trees to bring to the ocean and build a voyaging fleet. This example of historic practices linked to Hawai'i has been embedded within me and has helped shape my values and the way I look at the world today.

SB 2110 SD1 proposes to designate 'Ulu'ulu: the Henry Ku'ualoha Giugni Moving Image Archive of Hawai'i as the state archive for moving images. In so doing, we are able to preserve the historical accounts of who we are as a people and where we are in this special place, we call home. With the remarkable efforts being made with digital media in this State, this important repository is key for sharing our stories for future generations worldwide.
