CHAIRPERSON TSUJI and Members of the Committee:

STRONG SUPPORT.

My name is Loren Mochida, Director of Agricultural Operations at W. H. Shipman, Limited in Keaau on the Big Island. We are a local kamaaina-family owned land management company that is engaged in Agriculture and Commercial/Industrial development and leasing. We currently lease lands to over 130 individually growers at W.H. Shipman, Ltd.

W. H. Shipman, Ltd., and their growers provide strong support to SB 2354, SD1, Relating to Agricultural Commodities. This will establish criminal penalties for failure to maintain ownership of agricultural products or commodities. It will also assist in enforcement and deter thefts and the profits that thieves gain from them by clarifying the current requirements and requiring proof of identification upon sale of farm goods to buyers.

The majority of stolen products or commodities are often sold to vendors at the local farmers markets on the islands. In order to restrain people from selling stolen agricultural products or commodities, a certificate of ownership or written proof of ownership shall be required or they face criminal offenses.
