<u>PURPOSE</u>: The purpose of this bill is to establish a colorectal cancer screening program to assist individuals with the detection and care of colorectal cancer and appropriates funds for the program.

**DEPARTMENT'S POSITION**: The Department of Human Services supports the intent and understands the importance of colorectal cancer screening to detect and provide treatment. Given the fragile state of Hawaii's economy, however, we are unable to support the appropriation.

The Department agrees that outreach and education about colorectal cancer and early detection are important factors in treating the disease. Screening and treatment for colorectal cancer is a covered benefit under both the QUEST and QExA plans if detected. The health plans also emphasize preventive care and encourage screenings as appropriate.
