Subject: S.B. No. 2518, Relating to Motor and Other Vehicles

The City and County of Honolulu has no objections to extending the Hawaii driver license expiration date of a servicemember's dependent if the dependent accompanies the servicemember when deployed outside the United States.

We are concerned regarding recognition of a Status of Forces Agreement (SOFA) driver's license in lieu of a state issued driver's license. We understand that the SOFA driver license is valid only during the period that a state issued driver license is valid and only while the servicemember or servicemember's dependent is stationed in the foreign country.

The City and County of Honolulu recommends that S.B. No. 2518 be amended by deleting the words "and in-country" in the title of Section 286-106.5 and deleting subsection (b) of the bill.
