We thank the 2007 Legislature for appropriating funds for the initial 3Ts Program (Act 271). The funds appropriated to the Economic Development Alliance of Hawaii (EDAH) assisted KEDB, through its Aloha 'Ike Grant Program and Women in Technology Program (administered by Maui Economic Development Board statewide), has been able to start a technology laboratory at Kaua'i High School on a limited basis while still lending support a similar existing program at Chiefess Kamakahelei Middle School.
