Thank you for the opportunity to submit testimony in support of SB 2543. SB 2540 and SB 2543 amend Hawaii Revised Statutes section 302A for "housekeeping and other purposes." The Office of the Governor supports the intent of this bill in deleting provisions of HRS 302A that are already mandated by federal law and do not require codification in state statute, are policy and programmatic matters which are better suited to Board of Education or Department of Education policies, are programs or policies which have become obsolete or inactive, or are at a level of detail beyond expressing legislative intent or a legislative policy framework. A streamlined HRS 302A provides clear legislative policy directions expressed in statute.
