- 1 Department's Position: The Department of Health (DOH) supports enactment of this Administration
- 2 proposal as amended.
- 3 Fiscal Implications: None.
- 4 Purpose and Justification: This proposal amends duties and responsibilities of the Hawaii Advisory
- 5 Commission on Drug Abuse and Controlled Substances (HACDACS) to provide for more focused
- attention in addressing the issue of substance abuse as a public health issue by amending Section 329-4.
- 7 Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS).
- 8 As the advisory body that is administratively assigned to the Alcohol and Drug Abuse Division,
- 9 HACDACS provides community perspectives in the Department of Health (DOH) planning and
- implementation of substance abuse prevention and treatment services specified in Chapter 321, HRS.
- When the Department of Public Safety (PSD) was created, responsibility for the registration and
- 12 control of the manufacture, distribution, prescription and dispensing of controlled substances and
- precursor or essential chemicals was transferred from the DOH to PSD. Amendments in this
- "housekeeping" measure will more closely align the duties of the Commission with the core functions of

1	public health: assessment (i.e., monitoring trends and needs), policy development on public health
2	issues, and assurance of appropriate public health services. The scheduling of controlled substances
3	under Part II of Chapter 329, HRS, is a function performed by the Narcotics Enforcement Division
4	within the Department of Public Safety based on guidance from the U.S. Food and Drug Administration
5	and Drug Enforcement Administration.
6	The proposed statutory amendments will not diminish the Commission's role of advising the
7	Department of Health, the Governor and the Legislature on substance abuse related issues and concerns
8	In addition, the composition and number of members on the Commission will remain unchanged as will
9	the broad-based representation of the community.
10	The Department respectfully recommends passage of this measure as amended.

Chair Oshiro, Vice Chair Lee, and Members of the Committee:

The Department of Public Safety (PSD) supports Senate Bill 2820 that amends statutory provisions of the Hawaii Advisory Commission on Drug Abuse and Controlled Substances to provide for more focused attention in addressing the issue of substance abuse as a public health issue. The amendments to Section 329-4 HRS would clearly separate the duties of the Department's Narcotics Enforcement Division to maintain and conduct scheduling actions to Hawaii's Uniform Controlled Substance Act, while allowing the Department of Health's Hawaii Advisory Commission on Drug Abuse and Controlled Substances to focus on coordinating community programs relating to the prevention of drug abuse.

Section 329-4 was originally written when the Department's Narcotics Enforcement Division was a part of the Department of Health, this changed in 1989, when the Division was transferred to the Attorney General and subsequently transferred to the Department of Public Safety in 1990, without any amendments to this section. PSD supports the amendments being proposed in

SB 2820 as it will better describe the current function of the Department of Health's Hawaii Advisory Commission on Drug Abuse and Controlled Substances.
