<u>PURPOSE</u>: The purpose of S.B. 2833, S.D. 1 is to amend the definition of "employment" in various sections of the Hawaii Revised Statutes by clarifying the "domestic services" exclusion for services to persons with developmental and intellectual disabilities.

- 1 Department's Position: The department strongly supports this administration proposal.
- 2 Fiscal Implications: None.
- 3 Purpose and Justification: S.B. 2833, S.D. 1 will amend Chapter 383-7, 386-1, 392-5, and 393-5,
- 4 Hawaii Revised Statutes, to exempt recipients of federally funded social service payments with
- 5 developmental and intellectual disabilities from providing unemployment insurance, workers
- 6 compensation, temporary disability insurance, and pre-paid health care.
- 7 S.B. 2833, S.D. 1 will provide clarification by exempting recipients of the Department of Human
- 8 Services state-funded home and community based services from having to provide unemployment
- 9 insurance, workers compensation, temporary disability insurance, and pre-paid health care. This
- 10 exemption will allow flexibility for individuals receiving state funded medical assistance but, ineligible
- for Medicaid (Home and Community Based Services Medicaid Waiver program). These individuals
- will not have to pay those fees when service is performed by an individual whose services are contracted
- by a recipient of social service payments either as an independent contractor or employee of the
- 14 individual.

- 1 The Department of Health supports S.B. 2833, S.D. 1 as it will allow individuals with developmental
- 2 and intellectual disabilities greater access to needed services and the flexibility in obtaining such
- 3 services.

Re:S.B. No. 2833 SD1 Relating to Employment Exemption for Domestic Services for Persons with Developmental and Intellectual Disabilities

I. OVERVIEW OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION

This proposal amends Sections 386-1(6), 392-5(19), and 393-7(d), HRS, to broaden the definition of excluded domestic services for persons with developmental and intellectual disabilities under Medicaid to now include services "provided through state funded medical assistance to individuals ineligible for medicaid." The department supports this measure.

II. CURRENT LAW

The current statutes exclude from employment domestic services performed for persons with developmental and intellectual disabilities under the Medicaid home and community-based services program pursuant to Title 42 Code Federal Regulations.

III. COMMENTS ON THE SENATE BILL

The department supports the Administration's proposal from the Department of Health.
