Chair Representative Chang, Vice Chair Representative Har and Members of the Water, Land, Oceans Committee:

My name is Tim Johnston, Operations Manager of Ka'anapali Kai Charters. We have two commercial sailing catamarans, Teralani 2 & Teralani 3 that operate and beach load on Ka'anapali, Maui. We have been in business since 1994 and currently employ 26 people.

We appreciate the efforts being made by the Legislature in addressing swimmer vessel safety issues. We request that you also support the need for Kaanapali ORMA Permitted Vessel access to nearby state boating facilities when wind and sea conditions make beach loading either impossible or quite dangerous. We would like to see language like this put into SB 2933 that would guide DLNR to adopt rules to allow for the use of nearby State boating facilities on the island of Maui by the vessels with Kaanapali ORMA permits when wind and sea conditions make Kaanapali Beach untenable and accommodate their regular provisioning at nearby State Boating facilities for safety, and economic development.

Currently, when surf conditions prevent us from safely loading, we have no other option but to cancel our trips – even if conditions on the ocean are ideal. Having this option would allow us to operate in a safe manner and continue to keep the economy going strong.

We humbly ask you to please pass SB 2933 HD1 with amendments.

SUBJECT: SUPPORT OF SB 2933, SD2, HD1, RELATING TO OCEAN SAFETY

Thank you for the opportunity to testify in support of SB 2933, SD2, HD1. I provide this testimony as an individual member of the Maui County Council.

The purpose of this measure is to promote greater safety of ocean users in the State's nearshore waters and to appropriate funds for swim zone buoys at Kamaole beach. The measure would also require the Department of Land and Natural Resources to impose stricter regulations for the safety of ocean users, and to report back to the Legislature on the status of measures taken to address ocean safety concerns.

The safety of our nearshore waters has become increasingly important as the numbers of residents and visitors enjoying ocean activities has increased. A recent tragic incident at Hanakoo beach park underscores the need for clearly marked areas to protect swimmers and divers in areas with multiple ocean activities. The installation of swim zone buoys and establishment of stricter regulations will ensure a greater measure of safety in popular ocean activity areas.

As the Lana'i member on the Maui County Council, I would like to offer testimony in support of SB 2933, SD 2, HD1. This measure requires the department of land and natural resources to adopt rules that promote greater safety of ocean users in the State's nearshore waters; appropriates funds for swim zone buoys at Kamaole beach; requires a report to the legislature.

I support the proposed measure, because it attempts to address the increasing danger of collisions between boats and divers/swimmers. In 2011, Maui County had two fatal boating mishaps involving divers. On July 31, 2011, a diver was fatally struck by a motorized inflatable commercial Zodiac outside the breakwater of Kaumalapau Harbor on the Island of Lana'i. Then on December 29, 2011, a diver, who was preparing lanes for a high school cance paddling race, was fatally hit by a 19-foot recreational ski boat at Hanakaoo Beach on the Island of Maui.

Thank you for the opportunity to offer this testimony in support.

In consideration of SENATE BILL 2933, SENATE DRAFT 2, HOUSE DRAFT 1 RELATING TO OCEAN SAFETY

Senate Bill 2933, Senate Draft 2, House Draft 1 proposes to: (1) Require the Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) to adopt rules that promote greater safety of ocean users in the State's nearshore waters; (2) Appropriate funds for swim zone buoys at Kamaole Beach; and (3) Establish the West Maui ocean recreation management area advisory committee comprised of users of the ocean to work with the Department on issues relating to the area, particularly the waters of Kaanapali. The Department acknowledges the intent of this measure and offers the following comments.

The Department already has rules in place for the purpose of reducing user conflicts in the near shore waters of the State. Vessels are not permitted to operate in swim zones as it stands now and establishing safe zones for free diving will be very difficult because the activity takes place statewide and is not limited to specific areas.

The Department is open to having discussions with regards to increasing commercial vessel activity within the state small boat harbors when sea conditions make shoreline landings unsafe within designated ingress and egress zones. The Department will need to ensure that the increased commercial activity will not disrupt nor displace existing recreational use of the facility.

Chair Oshiro and Members of the Committee:

I am Tim Lyons, Executive Director of the Ocean Tourism Coalition an organization representing the commercial boating interests throughout the state.

We are in support of this bill as amended. We agree the bill addresses a problem of extreme importance and that is the safety of individuals utilizing the ocean recreation management area. Section 2 deals with the state developing rules for safe zones for free divers and swimmers as well as enforcement of the boating regulations.

It also deals with safety of passengers when loading and unloading on commercial use permitted boats in unforeseen weather conditions and also requests the Department to make rules for the utilization of these facilities under those conditions.

We would like to comment that we think the Advisory Committee in Section 7. will function better and achieve a more balanced result if it includes participation by a commercial use permit holder since the cooperation of commercial permit holders will be essential to the use and maintenance of state waters.

Based on the above, we can highly recommend the passage of this bill and would respectfully request your Committee's favorable consideration.
