- Department's Position: The Department of Health (DOH) supports the intent of SB 2958, SD2, takes
- 2 no position on an appropriation and defers to the Department of Budget and Finance on matters relating
- 3 to the financial implications to the Executive Supplemental Budget.
- 4 Fiscal Implications: The sum of an appropriation is to be determined or so much thereof as may be
- 5 necessary for fiscal year 2012-2013 out of the general revenues to the DOH.
- 6 Purpose and Justification: DOH recognizes the importance of providing these needed transplantation
- 7 services. This procedure treats patients with leukemia and some solid tumors such as breast and ovarian
- 8 cancer. In Hawaii, about 15 patients a year are in need of bone marrow transplants, the majority of
- whom must be treated within one to two months because of the aggressive nature of the disease. Without
- a bone marrow transplantation program in the state, patients waiting for transplantation would be left
- with the sole option of traveling to the mainland to receive potentially life-saving services.
