## SUBJECT: HEARING OF FEBRUARY 6, 2017, TESTIMONY IN SUPPORT OF SB 2996, MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR KIHEI HIGH SCHOOL

Thank you for the opportunity to testify in support of this important measure. The purpose of this measure is to authorize the issuance of \$20,000,000 in general obligation bonds and appropriate the necessary funding for the planning, design, and construction of the new Kihei High School, in Kihei, Maui.

The Maui County Council has not had the opportunity to take a formal position on this measure. Therefore, I am providing this testimony in my capacity as an individual member of the Maui County Council.

I support this measure for the following reasons:

- 1. Construction of a new Kihei High School will help to address overcrowding at other Maui high schools. Both Maui High School and Baldwin High School have current enrollments that exceed their design capacity. Population in the Kihei-Makena region is expected to increase 57 percent from 2000 to 2025. School overcrowding will only worsen unless construction is started as soon as possible so that Kihei students no longer are forced to travel to the Kahului and Wailuku high schools.
- 2. Completion of the school will help fulfill the goals and objectives of the Countywide Policy Plan, the Draft Maui Island Plan, and the Kihei-Makena Community Plan, all of which support providing a high school educational facility in the region.
- 3. Economic benefits from the project include design and construction employment in the short-term, followed by long-term employment from the estimated 120 permanent jobs at full build-out. This employment would provide an important boost to the local economy that would generate future State tax revenue.

For the foregoing reasons, I support this measure.

Comments:

The Kihei High School Action Team strongly supports the development of a high school in Kihei. This is a top priority for our community.

Significant population growth in the Kïhei-Mäkena region, coupled with the geographical separation from existing crowded central Maui high schools, has created the need for the proposed Kïhei High School. The proposed high school has been planned for in County planning documents such as the adopted Kïhei-Mäkena Community Plan (1998), adopted Countywide Policy Plan (March 2010) and the MIP General Plan 2030 Draft (December 2009).

The draft EIS is accurate in illustrating that the build-out of the Kïhei High School campus will boost the economy by providing design and construction-related employment during the phases of campus construction. The project is anticipated to provide approximately 120 permanent jobs at full build-out and occupancy. The jobs will include teachers, librarians, counselors, grounds maintenance staff, and administrators. The project will also result in indirect jobs supplying goods and services to construction companies and their employees and families. Construction of the project will provide considerable tax revenues for the County and State.

I currently serve as the Kamali'i Elementary School PTA President, representing 125 current members for over 650 students.

We are in favor of the proposed Bill to appropriate funds for the Kihei High School. South Maui is in desperate need of a High School for our kids. This Bill will help get us one step closer to achieving that goal. It's time that we move forward on a High School in South Maui, the idea of the overcrowding and long distance of the current high school for our kids is archaic.
