AMMENDED KE AUPUNI TESTIMONY FOR SB 3007 – RELATING TO INDIGENOUS PEOPLES DAY

We wish to amend our recommendation for the text for this bill to read as follows:

<u>Indigenous Peoples'</u> Day. The second Monday in October shall be known as Indigenous Peoples' Day to:

- (1) Recognize the amazing accomplishments of the indigenous voyagers that found and settled the myriad islands of the Pacific Ocean more than a thousand years before Columbus was born;
- (2) Recognize the countless indigenous peoples who perished as a result of the indigenous-European confrontation;
- (3) Recognize those indigenous peoples who have survived the past five hundred years; and
- (4) Educate the general public about the ongoing plight of indigenous peoples, provided that this day is not and shall not be construed to be a state holiday.
