In consideration of SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 107/SENATE RESOLUTION 51 REQUESTING THE GOVERNOR TO CONVENE A GOVERNOR'S SPECIAL TASK FORCE ON HAWAIIAN HISTORICAL SITES PRESERVATION

Senate Concurrent Resolution 107/Senate Resolution 51 requests the Governor to convene a special task force to develop a plan to provide fiscal stability and a source of continuous funding for the Bernice Pauahi Bishop Museum, Hulihe'e Palace, Washington Place, and 'Iolani Palace. While the Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) appreciates the intent of these resolutions, the Department however does not support the creation of another task force.

The Department instead recommends that in order to create a dedicated funding source, the Legislature reconvene Conference Committee on Senate Bill 333, Senate Draft 3, House Draft 2, from the 2011 Legislative Session, which proposes to deposit one per cent (1%) of all state capitol improvement funds into the Hawaii Historic Preservation Special Fund (Fund) specifically for the operations of the Department's State Historic Preservation Division and the routine maintenance of Iolani Palace, Washington Place, the Bishop Museum, and Mauna Ala. The bill could be further amended in Conference to include Hulihe'e Palace.

SITES PRESERVATION

On behalf of Historic Hawai'i Foundation (HHF), I am writing in <u>support of SCR 107/SR 51</u>. This resolution would request the governor to convene a task force to develop a plan to provide fiscal stability and a source of continuous funding for the Bernice Pauahi Bishop Museum, Hulihe'e Palace, Washington Place, and 'Iolani Palace. HHF recommends that Mauna Ala, the Royal Mausoleum, also be added to the list of historic sites to be considered by the task force.

The historic, cultural and natural resources of Hawai'i are a great legacy and irreplaceable treasures. HHF strongly supports measures that lead to investments in Hawaii's historic places and that help keep their stories alive for present and future generations.

All of the historic properties are designated as significant historic resources. Bishop Museum and Hulihe'e Palace are designated on the national register of historic places, as is Mauna Ala; Washington Place and 'Iolani Palace are both National Historic Landmarks, the highest level of recognition for historic significance and integrity. Each of these sites is an important icon for Hawai'i residents and visitors, adding to the enjoyment, education, and understanding of Hawaii's history and inspiration for the future. Yet all of them face great financial stressors and challenges to preserve and restore the historic features, provide public programming, and continue the great legacy that is their kuleana.

The special task force would be charged with investigating methods by which a continuous source of funding for each of these sites could be found, and require a report to the legislature. The legislature would then have a framework for future policy and legislative actions that would provide much needed support for these significance historic properties. We support the effort to identify additional funding sources to help preserve, restore, enhance and celebrate these historic and cultural treasures.

Therefore, HHF recommends that SCR 107/SR 51 be approved.
