<u>PURPOSE</u>: The purpose of this Concurrent Resolution is to request the Department of

Human Services to amend the Section 1115 waiver to raise the Medicaid income eligibility ceiling to 300% of the federal poverty level.

DEPARTMENT'S POSITION: The Department of Human Services (DHS) strongly opposes this resolution. The Department's QUEST and QExA enrollment was at approximately 286,000 as of February, 2012. The Department has continued to see an increase in the numbers for several years with no leveling off or decrease. The DHS cannot support the intent of the resolution as the Department does not have the funds to support the resulting increase to the Medicaid enrollment.

The increase in the income eligibility criteria will result in increased expenditures for the . Department that has not been budgeted.

Thank you for the opportunity to testify.

AlohaCare supports the intent of the measure to strengthen Hawaii's health safety net.

We would like to suggest the committee consider requesting an analysis by the Department of Human Services the Basic Health Plan (BHP) under the federal Affordable Care Act, as soon as possible once federal rules have been issued.

Preliminary information suggests BHP would provide new federal funding for health insurance coverage for Hawaii families with income between 133%-200% of the federal poverty level. Until recently, this is a group of approximately 4,500 individuals was covered by the Hawaii Medicaid QUEST-ACE and QUEST-NET program. The ACA Basic Health Option could restore benefits to this population, with generous federal financial support to the State.

Additionally, BHP specifically includes eligibility for lawfully present non-immigrants who are under the age of 65 and not eligible for Medicaid. A preliminary opinion from the National Immigration Law Center, obtained by AlohaCare, indicates that COFA migrants, who are currently not eligible for federal Medicaid funding, would be eligible for coverage under the Basic Health Plan. That would be a tremendous financial relief to the State of Hawaii, because a substantial portion, if not all of the cost of the Basic Health Plan premiums are expected to be paid by the federal government. Currently, the state bears the entire burden of Medicaid coverage for COFA migrants because of recent court rulings.

In order to implement this program, the State of Hawaii would need to proactively select this option. We have called this opportunity to the attention of the Governor and Pat McManaman, Director of the Department Human Services.

AlohaCare is a non-profit, Hawaii based health plan founded in 1994 by Hawaii's community health centers to serve low-income families and medically vulnerable members of our community through government sponsored health insurance programs. We serve beneficiaries of Medicaid and Medicare on all islands.
