The Department **supports SCR 36**, which requests DBEDT to work collaboratively with industry, the University of Hawaii, Kapiolani Community College, and the Hawaii Tourism Authority, to develop a plan for the expansion of the existing Hawaii Film Studio Diamond Head campus to accommodate increased studio capacity.

The studio in its current size and configuration can only support one production at a time. The Hawaii Film Studio has allowed Hawaii to offer the facility to production at reasonable rates as an additional incentive to make filming in Hawaii more cost effective.

The Diamond Head facility will continue to serve as a good location for television and commercial productions in Hawaii and the study will help to better understand the limitations of the current site for feature film productions and potentially identify other possible locations where a much larger, comprehensive facility would be more appropriate.
