- 3 **EOA's Position:** The Executive Office on Aging (EOA) supports the intent of this resolution
- 4 provided that its enactment does not reduce or replace priorities within our Supplemental Budget
- 5 Request.
- 6 Purpose and Justification: This resolution encourages that the Board of Education and
- 7 Department of Education allow public school campuses that have smaller student enrollments to
- 8 be used for Aging and Disability Resource Centers, senior centers, and other kupuna-related
- 9 programs to meet community needs and avoid the closure of schools. As we enter the baby boom

- the older generation will begin to increase rapidly, along with the demand for existing programs

- 3 help alleviate some of the projected demand for kupuna-related services, while helping public
