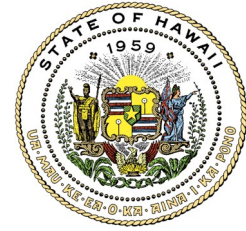

Legislative Issues

Brown Tree Snake May Wiggle Into Hawaii

Due to budget cuts, the state Department of Agriculture has allowed the brown tree snake program lapse. The dogs used for cargo inspections were actually given away. Rep. Marumoto will introduce legislation to get the inspections up and running again. Guam has 15,000 snakes per square mile that have eaten many birds, frogs as well as small pets. The snakes have also disrupted electrical power when the snakes short out transformers. With increased military and civilian flights expected from Guam, Hawaii can inherit this problem. Besides affecting our environment, the brown tree snake could easily devastate our poultry and egg industry.

Marumoto Gets Advocacy Award From Arthritis Foundation

District Concerns

An End to Kaimuki/Kaiser Community School for Adults?

The Board of Education decided to fund four community schools on Oahu. Unfortunately, the Kaimuki/Kaiser school, that currently serves 3,300 adults in East Honolulu, is not one of them. Principal Randal Tanaka is proposing increased fees and a charter school structure in order that the school can stay alive as a self-sufficient entity. With a federal grant and increased fees, this program can offer GED classes, adult basic education, English as a Second language, Civics, Workplace Education, Family Literacy, in addition to Life Long Learning courses. Rep. Marumoto supports this plan for self-sufficiency and, along with district legislators has petitioned the Board of Education to approve this proposal.

Transportation Issues

Rep. Marumoto has been after the DOT to re-landscape the planter boxes on H-1 above Kahala Mall. She assumes that this area was not on the APEC beautification radar. However, now that APEC is over, the DOT removed the weeds. Mahalo DOT! Also the old ewa section of the Honolulu Airport ticket lobby was refurbished. The representative asked the DOT not to remove the wooden sculpture feature that stretches across the width of Lobby 5 and 6. It was designed by the late and famous architect Vladimir Ossipoff so, now, if you are in the vicinity you can see it! Thank you, Rep. Marumoto. In an effort to slow down speeding, the City Department of Transportation Services is painting parking lanes on the main drag of Waiālae Iki Ridge – Laukahi Avenue. Because the driving lane is narrowed to 10’, we will see whether motorists slow down a bit. Mahalo DTS.

Marumoto Requests Go-Ahead on Girls Locker Room Projects

Rep. Marumoto wrote to the Governor and Superintendent of Schools requesting release of \$800,000 for the planning and design of the Kalani High Girls Locker Room. Construction funds must still be appropriated. She will submit an appropriation bill in 2012 for the construction money. A softball field in the back of campus is another Title IX project, but DOE facilities personnel say the planning process will determine whether there is enough space for the field even if it were placed *over* the parking lot. The DOE is at work with the planning and design of the Kaiser High girls locker room project.

Secretary Bryson said that he spent a year at Kaimuki Middle School many years ago. The 100th Infantry Battalion Veterans dedicated an educational display at the 44nd RCT Clubhouse.
