A brief description of the applicant's background:
 Anekona Ouli Kanehoa VFD Company ("AOK") is a Hawaii nonprofit corporation organized by neighborhood members to support the local volunteer fire company "9 Bravo".
 9 Bravo is a Hawaii County trained and certified fire company that assists the County Fire Department during emergencies. While the County supplies these volunteers with some equipment, there are always

shortfalls due to public budget constraints. AOK attempts to fill this need with other sources of funding.

Officers and directors of AOK include a semi-retired real estate developer, a

practicing architect, a building subcontractor and skilled craftsmen. AOK was formed in 2010, and was initially funded by 44 cash donations from homeowners. These funds were applied in part to purchase individual protective gear (coats, pants, boots, etc.) required to outfit volunteer firefighters. A portion of the funding was used to acquire a government surplus 5-ton 6X6 truck, which was outfitted as an off-road tanker for combating wildfires. AOK worked with the County Fire Department to complete the improvements needed to make the vehicle suitable for this service. AOK also provided various parts and equipment to outfit a second ¾-ton "brush truck", which is also assigned to 9 Bravo for use. Additional volunteer assistance is being provided by a local architect, a surveying and engineering firm, and a land use consultant in connection with the project described below.

2. The goals and objectives related to the request:

AOK VFD is pursuing the development of a Volunteer Apparatus Garage ("VAG"), to centralize and secure the 9 Bravo vehicles and equipment which are currently being stored at 9 Bravo volunteers private residences without cover, contrary to best management practices. This request will assist AOK in completing necessary permitting and offsite improvements needed to build out the VAG. Additional funding for this work will be available from financial donations and in-kind support.

Upon completion of the project, AOK will seek to donate the facility to Hawaii County for use by the Fire Department. The Department owns and maintains several VAGs which serve similar purposes for other volunteer companies. In

these instances, the County will provide insurance coverage, and will cover utility and other occupancy costs.

Access and use of the VAG will be controlled by the Fire Department, but 9 Bravo volunteers will utilize the facility for training, maintenance of vehicles and equipment, and storage of personal protective gear needed during emergencies.

3. State the public purpose and need to be served:

The volunteers of 9 Bravo provide added emergency response capabilities to combat structure and wildfire threats in South Kohala, and are also called on to support firefighting in North Kohala, North Kona and Hamakua Districts.

9 Bravo is called upon by the County Fire Department routinely, and has responded to work on 24 wildfires in the past two years. The rapid response of firefighters with tank trucks has been of significant assistance in several of these emergencies.

In addition, 9 Bravo has responded to a number of false alarms, disaster preparedness situations such as tsunami warnings, and special services offered by the Department such as homeowner counseling to prevent wildfire damage.

- 4. Describe the target population to be served:

 The target population served is the residents and businesses within the North and South Kohala Districts, with some response in Hamakua and North Kona as needed. The areas served consist of small, isolated communities interspersed with vast open space between them and with a large population of senior citizens.
- 5. Describe the geographic coverage.

 North and South Kohala, Hamakua and North Kona Districts of Hawaii County.

II. Service Summary and Outcomes

 - 3. Building construction will begin upon completion of site work, with much of this work provided by in-kind donations. Additional grants from private and public agencies will be requested to assist in this segment of the work.

- 4. It is intended that completion of the facility will be accomplished by December 2014.

Design and construction will be done according to Hawaii County Planning and Building regulations, all with appropriate permits. Currently, a commitment for water service has been obtained. Preliminary design has been discussed with County Fire Department officials, and a dialogue with this agency will be continued, as they will be the recipient of the facility. Finally, all work will meet County requirements in order to "close out" all required construction permits.

4. The applicant shall list the measure(s) of effectiveness that will be reported to the State agency through which grant funds are appropriated (the expending agency). The measure(s) will provide a standard and objective way for the State to assess the program's achievement or accomplishment. AOK has received an initial grant from the Richard Smart Foundation of \$9,000 to allow funding of preliminary design and permitting activities. Donations from neighbors and in-kind help from design professionals have been received.



Additional donations will be solicited, and certain professionals have indicated an interest in providing in-kind assistance for completion of design and permitting activities. Certain local building suppliers have indicated preliminary interest in providing similar assistance for materials. Finally, the local fire-aware neighbors have indicated willingness to provide the assistance of skilled craftsmen when appropriate.

A Kona-based surveying company has provided surveying and mapping support for the project. Certain 9 Bravo volunteers are skilled craftsmen, and are available to provide labor in completing the project. All of these individuals have indicated a willingness to work without compensation.

Currently, the 9 Bravo volunteers store the assigned vehicles and equipment at their personal residences. Vehicles are parked without cover, and this condition is detrimental to best management practices.

A copy of the preliminary design for the VAG is attached. Final design will include consideration and accomplishment of all County requirements, including ADA requirements.


AOK's Volunteer Apparatus Garage Project:

AOK is proceeding with the development a Volunteer Apparatus Garage ("VAG") for the storage and maintenance of two tank trucks and other equipment assigned to the 9 Bravo volunteer company. The scope of work, tasks and responsibilities of this project include:

- 1) A suitable location has been determined off Waiula Street, just makai of Anekona Subdivision. This location is accessible from two points onto Kawaihae Road. County Fire Department personnel have inspected the location and indicated that it will be very suitable for the VAG.
- 2) The landowner has agreed to lease AOK the 3-plus acre site for this purpose for 99 years at a nominal rent. AOK has applied for subdivision approval of the lot, a prerequisite of the lease. Survey and mapping has been donated by a Kona-based surveyor.
- 3) A preliminary design for the VAG has been prepared by a local architect, utilizing information from earlier projects of a similar nature. AOK has requested input from the County Fire Department, to be sure that the project meets the needs and requirements of the Department.
- 4) Funding for construction of improvements may require several efforts, and some time. In 2012, AOK has received a \$9,000 grant from the Richard Smart Foundation to support costs of subdivision and permitting. Other sources of funding, including this request, will be explored. Past efforts to obtain donations from the general public will be continued.
- 5) Once Tentative Subdivision is received, AOK will organize labor and materials needed to make the required improvements. It is expected that these items will include improvement of the access road, utility connections, storm drainage and grading. In-kind donations from suppliers and contractors will be solicited for this work.
- 6) A commitment for potable water service has been arranged with the Hawaii County Department of Water Supply. Water service will be available from a main distribution line adjacent to the property.
- 7) Upon completion of all preconditions and receipt of a Final Subdivision, AOK will enter into the ground lease and begin construction. This work will involve building construction and related driveway and security improvements. Skilled craftsmen have volunteered to assist in this work, and various in-kind donations from suppliers will be sought.

- 8) Upon completion of the facility, it is intended that the facility and the land lease will be donated to the County for Fire Department use. After discussion with Hawaii County Fire and Corporation Counsel representatives, AOK is following an established program wherein various volunteer companies on the island have created VAG facilities. In some cases, land developers or others have built and donated similar properties. In this case, AOK wishes to take advantage of the generosity and skills available in the South Kohala area to complete the facility, and then make the donation. It is understood that AOK must complete the facility in a fully-permitted fashion, all in conformance with County and other governmental rules and regulations.
- 9) After completing the donation and upon receiving occupancy permission, and in conjunction with County Fire Department practice, the facility will be utilized by the Department and the volunteers of 9 Bravo for training and maintenance and storage of vehicles and equipment. The County will also utilize the facility on an as-needed basis, whenever emergency or training situations are underway. Given its central location between two existing County Fire Stations (Waimea Town and Mauna Lani/Queen Kaahumanu Highway), the site will most likely be used to store other firefighting equipment provided by the Department.
