A brief description of the applicant's background; The Boys & Girls Club of Hawaii (BGCH) has been providing youth development programs to the youth on Oahu and Kauai since the first clubhouse opened adjacent to Washington Intermediate School in 1976. Over 12,000 youth between the ages of 7 and 17 received services from BGCH in 2012. With additional clubhouses in Waianae, Nanakuli, Ewa Beach, and Kapaa on Kauai, and school based programs in Waimea and Lihue on Kauai and at Kailua Intermediate School, BGCH provides a safe place for keiki to go in the critical after school hours. Membership is open to all at a nominal cost of \$1 per year.
- 2. The goals and objectives related to the request;

This request for \$1,300,000 in state GIA funding is to support the construction of new covered athletic courts at Kailua Intermediate School. The Boys & Girls Club of Hawaii (BGCH) has been planning to construct a new clubhouse at this school since 2006, soon after BGCH began offering programs from a borrowed classroom at the school. In June, 2012, BGCH and the DOE agreed on a 50 year lease for a site on the campus upon which BGCH shall construct new clubhouse and related facilities and provide after school programs. The construction is planned in three phases. Phase 1 involves the reconstruction of the existing school's boys' locker room into new separate boys' and girls' locker rooms for use by the school. This phase is funded by a CIP grant from the State of Hawaii of \$1,500,000. Phase 2 involves rehabbing and expanding the current girls' locker room building into a new 7,500 square foot clubhouse. This phase has an estimated cost of \$4,000,000 and BGCH has raised the funds for this phase from foundations, corporations and individuals. Phase 3 involves the construction of a roof and mesh style walls over the current outdoor basketball courts. The current asphalt courts will be replaced with a rubberized sport court that will have a removable in line hockey rink. The estimated cost of Phase 3 is \$2,300,000 and BGCH has a pledge of \$1,000,000 to cover part of the costs of Phase 3.

- The public purpose and need to be served:

 The new Windward Clubhouse will provide the thousands of keiki in Kailua,

 Kaneohe, Waimanalo and surrounding Windward communities with the option of
 going to a safe place in the after school period. Caring adult staff members
 become mentors to many of these youth who often see the Club as a second home.

 Programs such as Power Hour help students with homework and related academic
 issues. Sports activities and healthy choices programs help to fight the crisis of
 childhood obesity. Overall, BGCH helps youth to become responsible citizens.
- 4. Describe the target population to be served: all keiki ages 7 to 17 in the Windward area.
- 5. Describe the geographic coverage: all Windward communities.

II. Service Summary and Outcomes

This request is to provide construction funding of the covered athletic courts at Kailua Intermediate School; once constructed, the courts will be available for use by the school during each school day, and then for use by BGCH in the after school hours.

BGCH is currently planning to begin construction on Phases 1 and 2 of this project in the summer of 2013. If sufficient funds are made available, then Phase 3, the covered courts, will begin as well in this time period.

3. Describe its quality assurance and evaluation plans for the request. Specify how the applicant plans to monitor, evaluate, and improve their results:

BGCH has contracted with WTN, an architectural firm that it successfully worked with in constructing the award winning, gold LEED-certified, new Clubhouse in Nanakuli that opened in 2009. BGCH is confident that WTN, working in conjunction with construction manager, Group Pacific, will ensure that this construction project will be of the highest quality. BGCH staff will monitor the construction project on a weekly basis.

4. List the measure(s) of effectiveness that will be reported to the State agency through which grant funds are appropriated (the expending agency). In terms of construction projects, since the construction of the Charles C. Spalding Clubhouse in 1976, BGCH has successfully constructed new clubhouses in Waianae, Ewa Beach, Kapaa, and Nanakuli. In all of these projects, BGCH had previously run programs out of the adjacent schools or in temporary structures. Once each clubhouse was completed, it was soon filled with children from the surrounding community.


