I. Background and Summary

- 1. A brief description of the applicant's background: Life Foundation was established in 1983 as one of the first AIDS programs in the country, and we remain the largest and most comprehensive AIDS organization in Hawaii. Life Foundation is based in Honolulu on the island of Oahu, and provides both HIV prevention and testing to the people of Oahu, as well as in-house case management services for people living with HIV on our island. Life Foundation works closely with the STD/AIDS Prevention Branch (SAPB) of the Hawaii State Department of Health (DOH).
- 2. The goals and objectives related to the request: Life Foundation is seeking general operating support to fund the areas that its contracts through the Centers for Disease Control and Hawaii State Department of Health do not cover. These costs includes administration of our HIV care and prevention departments, public awareness events, websites, social marketing campaigns, HIV public awareness campaigns, as well as a shortfall in our HIV care program and integrated care program. The overall goal of this request is to ensure the financial health and stability of Life Foundation and that the agency's programs and services are properly promoted to the community which they serve. The objectives of this request are as follows:
 - a. 2,500 free and anonymous HIV tests administered to the public.
 - b. 700 HIV positive individuals receive services through Life Foundation.
 - c. Agency website, brochures, and social media are kept up to date with relevant HIV prevention and care information.
 - d. Information about HIV testing and care is disseminated to public through advertising, newsletters, social media, and public awareness events to ensure the community is knowledgeable about accessing Life Foundation's programs and services.
- 3. The public purpose and need to be served: Currently, the majority of Life Foundation's HIV positive clients are Native Hawaiians, people of Asian ancestry and people from other Pacific Islands (APIs). By far, Hawai'i has the highest proportion of AIDS cases among APIs nationally. This is significant because 2/3s of APIs have never been tested for HIV, yet represent one of the fastest growing demographic of HIV positive individuals. HIV related stigma has proven to be high among these populations, creating barriers to both HIV testing and access to care services.

4. **Describe the target population to be served:** As stated above, majority of Life Foundation's HIV positive clients are Asian, Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander. The average incidence rate of AIDS reported in Hawai'i for 2004-2008 was 7.5 cases per 100,000 persons, which is about half the national rate. Compared to U.S. data, Hawai'i's AIDS cases had high proportions of males (83% vs. 63%), male to male sex exposure (60% vs. 50%), Caucasians (50% vs. 29%), and NHAPI (28% vs. 1.5%) (Source: HI DOH and CDC). Approximately 97% of the clients served through Life Foundation's HIV prevention programs are considered high risk. HIV prevention outreach contacts average about 25,000 per year, with about 2,300 HIV tests conducted. This data is from the Outreach Program database that Life Foundation utilizes to collect all prevention data (testing data, individual level interventions, condom distribution, etc.).

5. **Describe the geographic coverage:** Life Foundation operates on the island of Oahu, offering HIV testing and prevention services island-wide. Any HIV positive person who is a resident of the island of Oahu is eligible for services. Life Foundation also provides capacity building services to AIDS organizations on neighboring islands, as well as organizations in the Pacific Islands.

II. Service Summary and Outcomes

1. **Describe the scope of work, tasks and responsibilities:** Through this request, Life Foundation will ensure its HIV testing and HIV care programs are properly promoted and communicated to the public. This request will also ensure the financial stability of Life Foundation through making up for lack of funding for its care and prevention programs.

2. Provide a projected annual timeline for accomplishing the results or outcomes of the service:

- a. August 2013 Conduct annual client survey to 700 HIV positive clients to see what their needs are and evaluate the performance of Life Foundation.
- b. September 2013 Conduct website analysis to see what needs to be done to most effectively communicate services to public of Hawaii.
- c. December 2013 Hold World AIDS Day event to increase Life Foundation presence in community.
- d. March 2014 Hold Women's Day retreat for HIV positive women in community.
- e. April 2014 Hold Honolulu AIDS Walk largest AIDS public awareness event in Hawaii.
- f. May 2014 Hold educational event for National Asian and Pacific Islander HIV/AIDS Awareness Day
- g. June 2014 Educate public about HIV testing through National HIV Testing Day.

- 3. Describe its quality assurance and evaluation plans for the request. Specify how the applicant plans to monitor, evaluate, and improve their results: For the past eight years, Life Foundation has participated in the evaluation phases of several multiyear federal grants including two three-year grant cycles under contract with the U.S. HHS Office of Minority Health and two directly funded CDC Community Based Organization HIV Prevention Cooperatives Agreements. Each of these has had very stringent data reporting requirements, which we have fully complied with. Just about all Life Foundation management and staff have had an active role in data gathering and evaluation. The staff members who participate in the proposed project will all be oriented and trained in the data gathering and reporting needs of our local evaluation team. In addition, Life Foundation was one of four successful national applicants in 2010 to provide local on-site evaluation of RESPECT, one of the CDC approved evidencebased HIV prevention interventions (EBIs), under its CBO Monitoring and Evaluation Program (CMEP). The purpose of CMEP is to improve the performance of CDC-funded CBOs delivering particular individual- or group-level behavioral risks. Our CMEP Specialist, Michele Sete, will work with involved staff to ensure proper evaluation of the project is completed.

In addition to long standing case management contracts, SAPB/DOH have also contracted consistently with Life Foundation for HIV prevention outreach services targeting gay men, transgender people. high risk women and youths. Life Foundation has been a CDC directly funded community based organization since 2004, contracted with the Office of Minority Health from 2004 to 2010, and has been a CDC-funded capacity building assistance (CBA) provider since 2004 through subcontracts with the Asian and Pacific Islander American Health Forum and Asian and Pacific Islander Wellness Center, both in San Francisco. The Hawaii Office of Hawaiian Affairs (OHA) has contracted with Life Foundation to provide HIV care and prevention services for Native Hawaiian people, especially those who reside in the rural parts of Oahu. OHA has supported various Life Foundation programs for Native Hawaiian people for more than 15 years. Life Foundation's HIV case management program has been operating formally since 1989. Its staff includes mental health case managers, medical case managers and an HIV clinical nurse. Life Foundation is not a primary care medical facility and, accordingly, works closely with AIDS-treating physicians throughout Oahu. Life Foundation works closely with the Clint

Spencer Clinic, a patient care program of the Hawaii Center for AIDS of the University of Hawaii Medical School.

B. Facilities

Our facilities are ADA compliable. Life Foundation also does outreach across the island to provide services to individuals who may not be able to travel to us, or do not feel comfortable entering an "AIDS Organization" due to the stigma attached to the disease.

V. Personnel: Project Organization and Staffing

A. Proposed Staffing, Staff Qualifications, Supervision and Training

As a result, new prevention staff members are already completely oriented to the risk groups they will be working with and are often known to the people to whom they will be reaching out. Our communications and development office has a combined 17 years experience in non-profit social marketing.


