6. DESCRIPTIVE TITLE OF APPLICANT'S REQUEST:

An expansive courtyard dominates the 2nd floor areas at FilCom Center where the program spaces are located. The courtyard has been a gathering place for families and children. However, its use is limited during inclement weather when its wet tiles create unsafe conditions. On the other hand, the hot mid-day sun makes the place unbearable for the younger kids and the elderly. A retractable light weight roof over the courtyard will make this area less hazardous to children and seniors, and allows the FilCom to offer a better array of activities at the courtyard. We would like to install a light "retractable" system made of fabric over, or under, a light gauge steel frame that can easily be removed if necessary. There are advantages to using this system over the courtyard. Light and air can still filter through and there are no mechanical moving parts that could cause high maintenance costs. Because the system is lightweight, the existing structural system will be able to carry the load without the addition of load-bearing components

The Filipino Community Center (FilCom) is gathering place for activities promoting, sharing and perpetuating Filipino heritage with the larger multi-cultural community of Hawaii. In addition to the many social and human service programs conducted for all members of the community, FilCom also houses and various cultural and educational initiatives: NCLEX licensing review for nurses, citizenship classes, financial literary classes, entrepreneurial training courses, job skills training and computer basics, after school cultural programs for kids (Banda Kawayan) and others.
Since 2002, the Filipino Community Center (FilCom) has been a gathering place for activities promoting, sharing and perpetuating Filipino heritage with the larger multi-cultural community of Hawaii. A tax exempt, non-profit organization as defined under section 501(c) 3 of the U.S. Internal Revenue Service, the FilCom was built through the generous donations of foundations, trusts, private corporations and government entities. During the last 10 years since it opened its doors, the FilCom has offered programs that targeted the low-income and immigrant groups of various age groups. We hold citizenship classes, review courses for immigrant nurses, cultural programs for children, the youth and seniors, and computer literacy courses.
2. The goals and objectives related to the request;
The installation of the retractable roof over the courtyard will enable the Filipino Community Center to increase its programs that target Hawaii's low-income, immigrant and refugee populations. This will enable us to offer better programs that help eliminate workforce barriers to economic self-sufficiency by providing activities that enhance language skills, computer literacy, and other skills that can help immigrants achieve financial independence.
3. The public purpose and need to be served;
Since 2002, the Filipino Community Center (FilCom) has been a gathering place for activities promoting, sharing and perpetuating Filipino heritage with the larger multi-cultural community of Hawaii. During the last 10 years since it opened its doors, the FilCom has offered programs that targeted the low-income and immigrant groups of various age groups. We hold citizenship classes, review courses for immigrant nurses, cultural programs for children, the youth and seniors, and computer literacy courses.

4. Describe the target population to be served; and
The entire Hawaii population is served with emphasis on the surrounding residents of Waipahu.
5. Describe the geographic coverage.
The entire island of Oahu with emphasis on Leeward Oahu, specially the surrounding areas in Waipahu where the FilCom is located.

II. Service Summary and Outcomes

The quality of materials and installation will be described fully in the Request for Proposals. A facilities committee composed of licensed architects and engineers will prepare, review and implement the procurement process as well as provide oversight for the construction.

Rose Cruz Churma, as the President and Chief Operating Officer of the FilCom Center will be responsible for assuring that the terms of the grant are complied with. She was involved with the fund development and project management and construction of the center during its early formative years until the center received its building occupancy permit in 2001. Although an architect by training, she was also involved in organizing a variety of events in the State as part of her community work. Since she joined FilCom in March 2012, she shepherded the successful staging of the May 2012 Fiesta & Parade, as well as the FilCom sponsored events in 2012—the FilCom Sundays (September 30 and October 28, 2012—held at the FilCom) and the annual Pasko sa FilCom on December 16, 2012.

Manny Lanuevo is a licensed electrical engineer and is an officer at the City's H-Power program and was the deputy director of Environmental Services during the terms of Mayors Carlisle and Hannemman.

Jeffrey Cudiamat heads his own structural engineering firm Structural Hawaii, Inc.

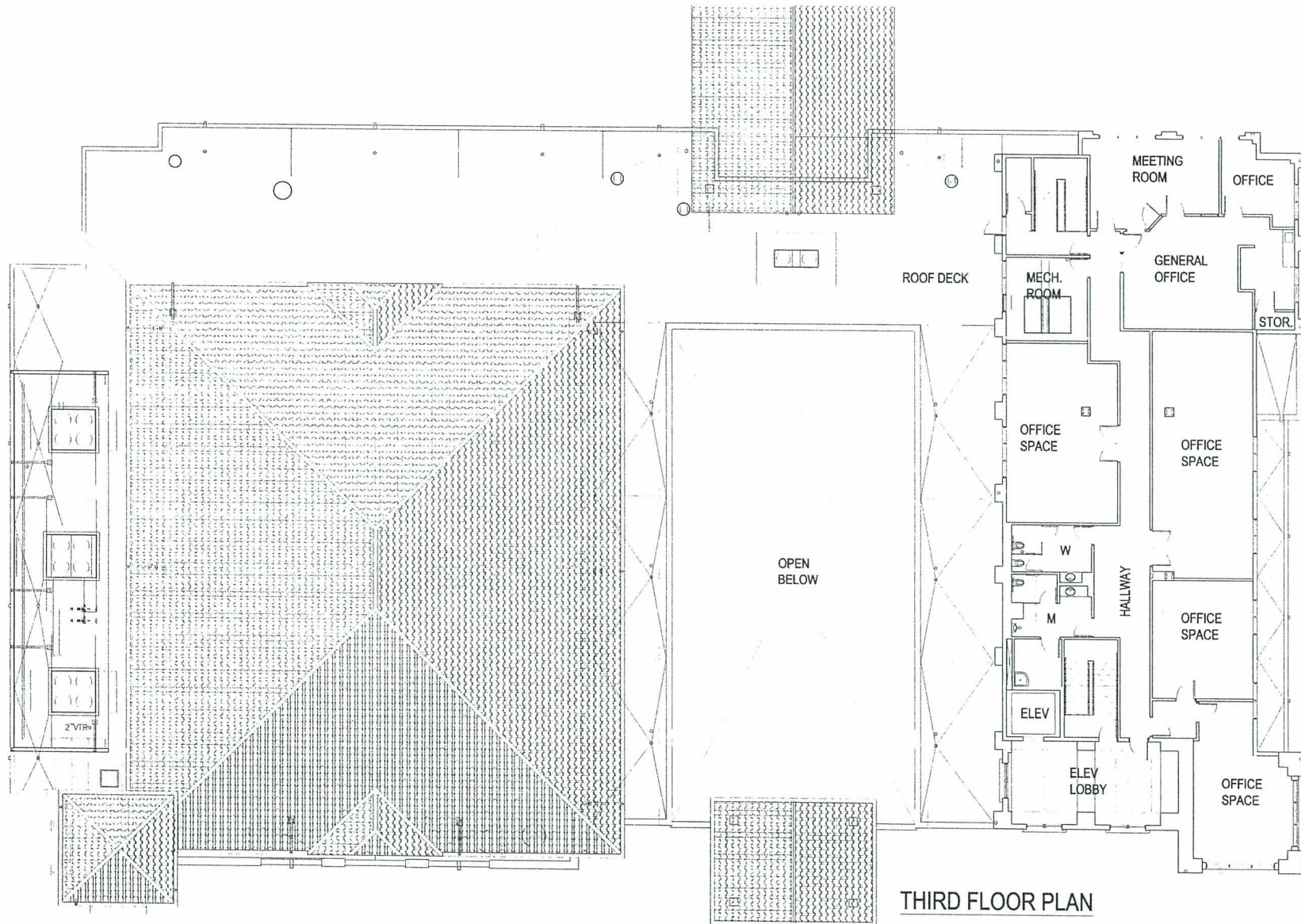

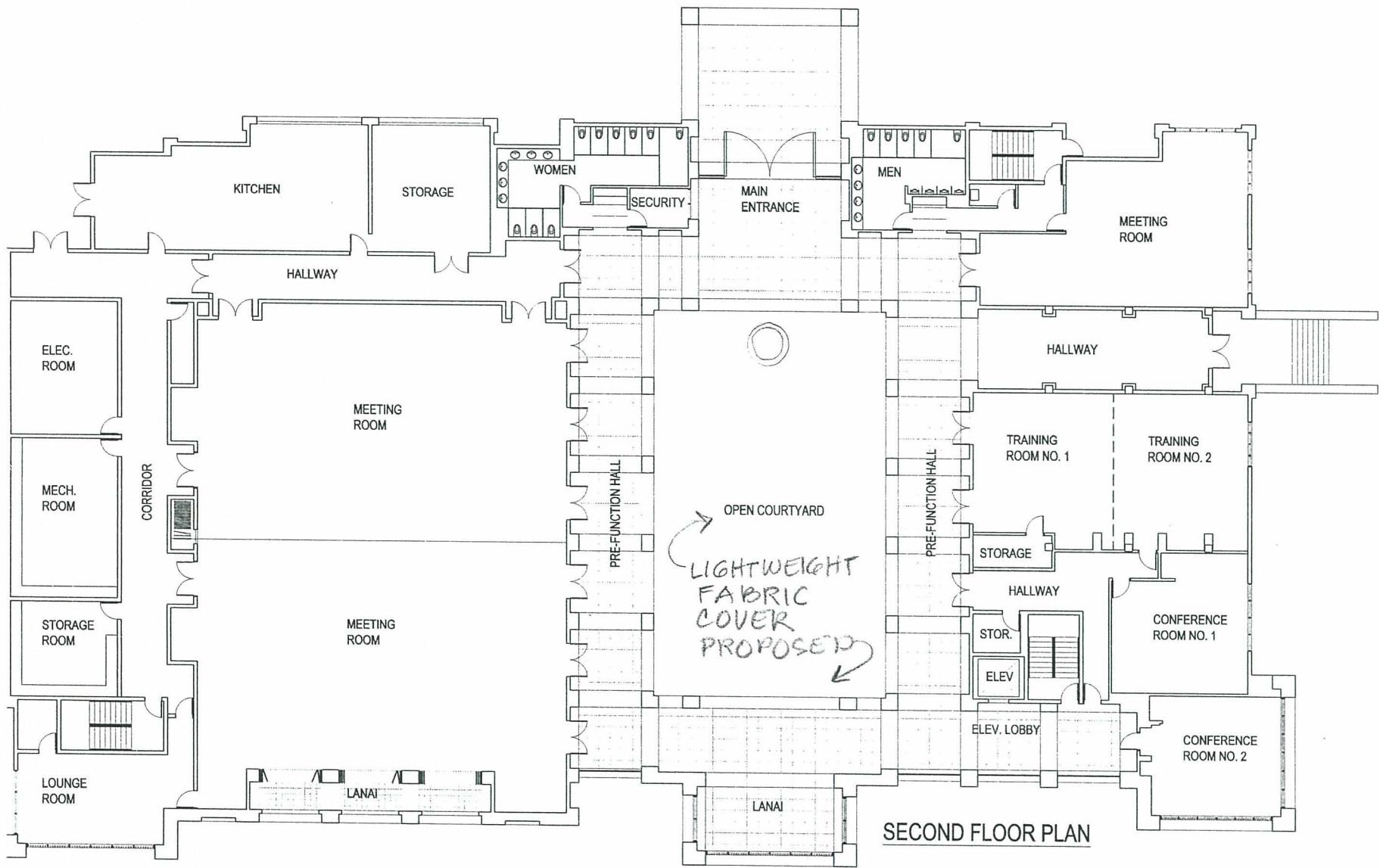

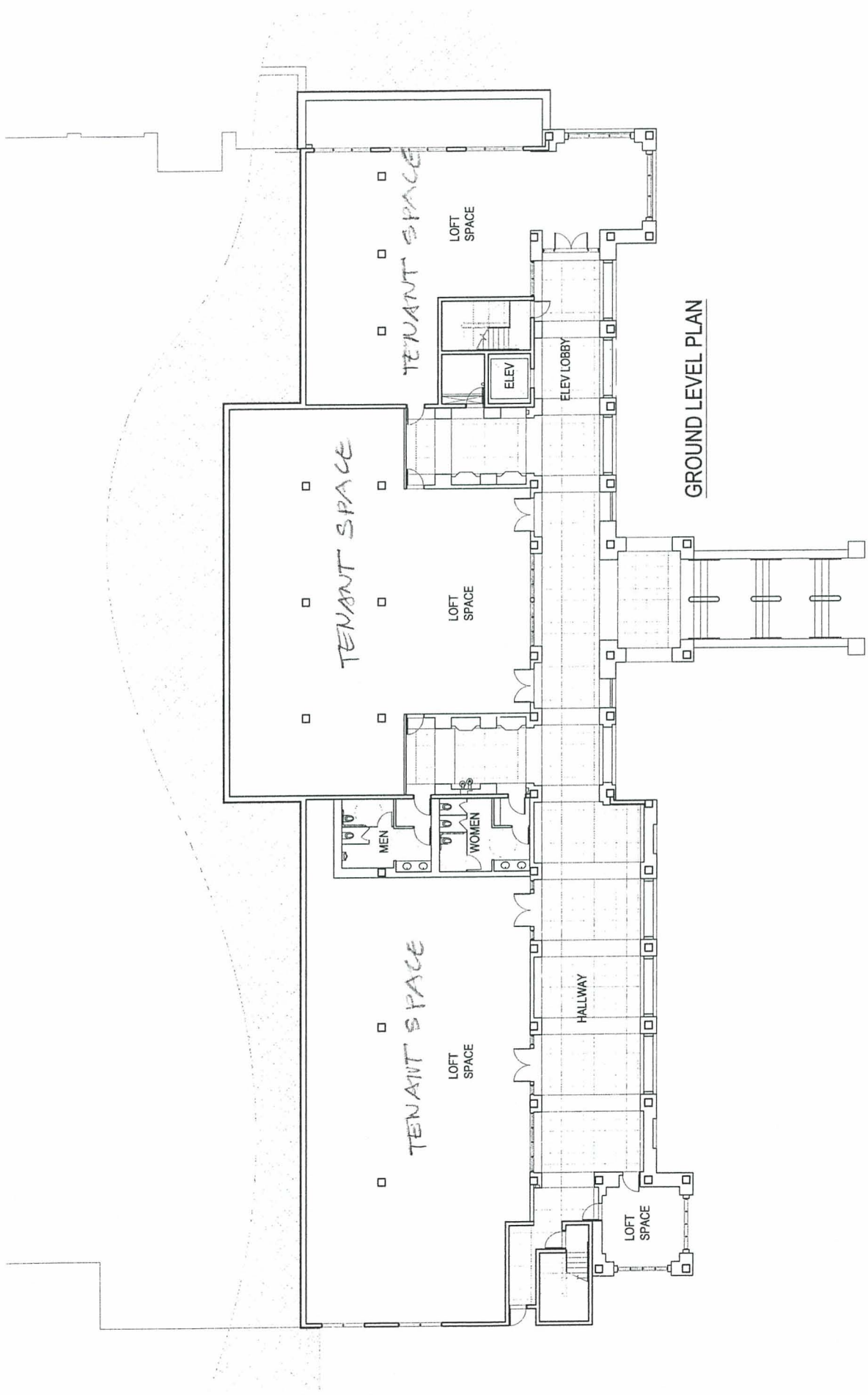

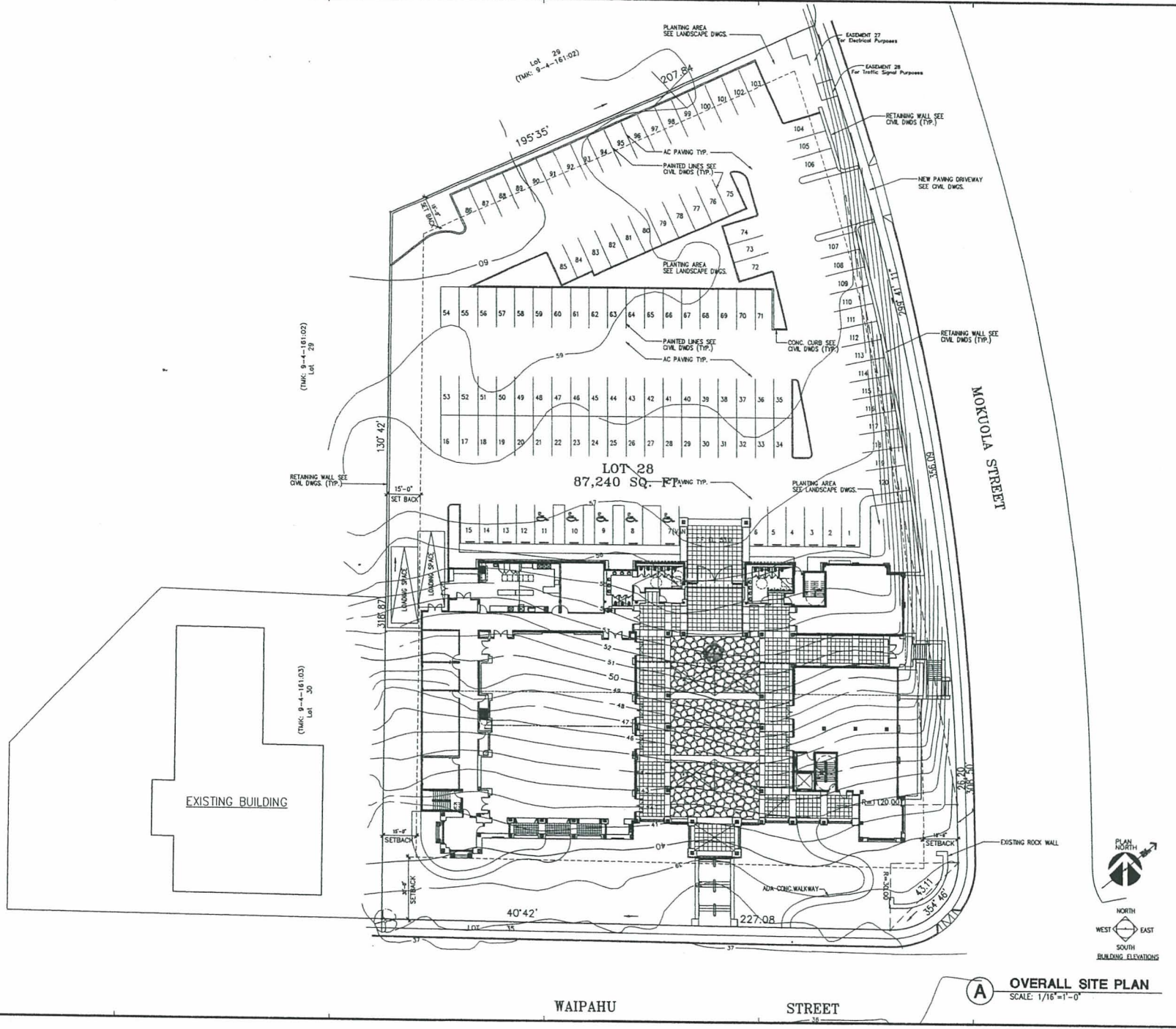


THE FILIPINO COMMUNITY CENTER
