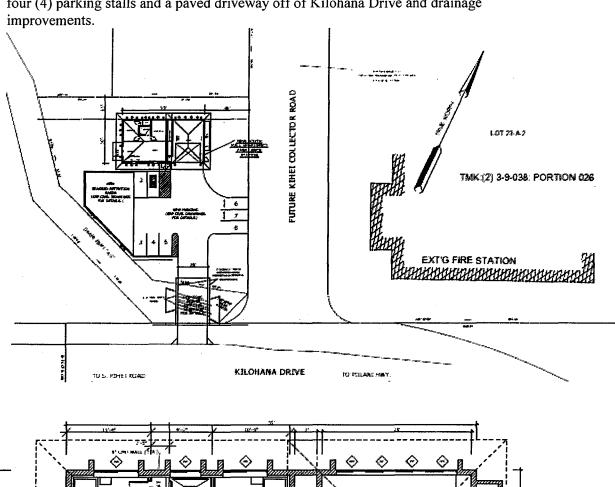

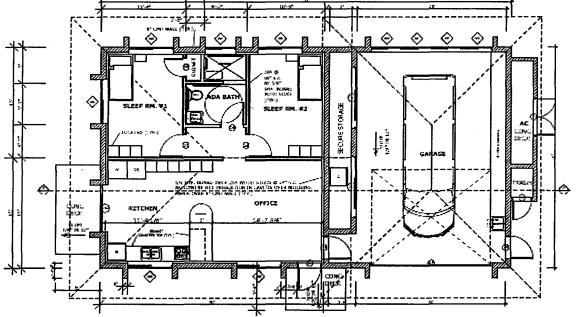

1. Describe the scope of work, tasks and responsibilities;

The Wailea Community Association (WCA), a 501(c)(4), not-for-profit corporation, proposes to construct a new 1,500 SF emergency ambulance station and related improvements at the Wailea Fire Station property. The new facility will replace the current leased residential facility in a neighboring community which is being utilized on a temporary basis. The approximately one (1) acre project site is situated adjacent to the existing 3.152 acre Wailea Fire Station property. The project site is situated at the gateway to the Wailea Resort; a master planned resort-residential community. The County of Maui is the fee-simple owner of the property underlying the project site. The County will be named on the building permit and SMA application. Once the facility is complete, the County of Maui will initiate proceedings to accept the building from the WCA (acceptance is made by the County Council). The County will lease the building to the ambulance provider and will include maintenance and utility costs in the lease.

The proposed ambulance station will be a single-story building approximately 50 feet by 30 feet with approximately 1,500 square feet of floor area. The building will house an ambulance for emergency response service (911), sleeping and living quarters for two (2) emergency response personnel, an office area, small kitchen and medical supply storage area. The emergency ambulance station will be operational 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Related improvements include site grading, installation of underground utilities, four (4) parking stalls and a paved driveway off of Kilohana Drive and drainage





2. Provide a projected annual timeline for accomplishing the results or outcomes of the service;

The WCA has completed the construction documents for the project, as well as an environmental assessment. Pre-bid analysis estimates the cost of the project at \$1 million including extensive site work. The WCA has private funding of \$250,000 plus a commitment from the Honua'ula developers for \$250,000. The WCA plans to bid the project in summer of 2013 and award the contract immediately thereafter. The construction timeline is estimated to take twelve (12) months.

- 3. Describe its quality assurance and evaluation plans for the request. Specify how the applicant plans to monitor, evaluate, and improve their results; and Currently, emergency ambulance response services for Maui County are provided by American Medical Response (AMR) under contract with the State of Hawaii. The company operates nine (9) emergency ambulance stations on the island of Maui. The South Maui station is currently housed in a rented cottage located in Maui Meadows, a residential community, about 1 mile northeast of the project site. The emergency ambulance service responds to emergency 911 calls involving medical and traumatic injuries. The South Maui station responds to a total of approximately 130-150 calls per month. All patients are transported to Maui Memorial Medical Center for medical care. The new emergency ambulance station adjacent to the Wailea Fire Station will enhance AMR's ability to respond to emergencies in South Maui on a timely basis.
