A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSES.

	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:
1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that currently only
2	nurses who have master's degrees in nursing can be recognized as
3	advanced practice registered nurses in Hawaii. This precludes
4	nurses who earn their doctor of nursing practice or other
5	clinical doctorates in nursing recognized by the Hawaii state
6	board of nursing and directly impacts doctor of nursing practice
7	graduates of the University of Hawaii at Manoa school of nursing
8	and dental hygiene and University of Hawaii at Hilo school of
9	nursing. Similarly, other states' advanced practice registered
10	nurses with doctor of nursing practice degrees are precluded
11	from being recognized as advanced practice registered nurses in
12	Hawaii.
13	In 2012, the National Council of State Boards of Nursing
14	reported that all states except Hawaii and West Virginia accept
15	a graduate degree instead of a master's degree provision in
16	their laws for advanced practice registered nurse licensure and
17	certification. West Virginia has since passed legislation to

change its state practice act to reflect "graduate" degree in HB79 HD1 HMS 2013-2114

1	nursing instead of "master's" degree as a requirement for			
2	advanced practice registered nurse licensure.			
3	The purpose of this Act is to change the degree requirement			
4	for advanced practice registered nurse recognition from a			
5	master's degree in nursing to a graduate degree in nursing.			
6	SECTION 2. Section 457-8.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
7	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:			
8	"(a)	[Effective October 1, 2009, the] The board shall		
9	gran	t recognition as an advanced practice registered nurse		
10	to a	nurse who has:		
11	(1)	A current, unencumbered license as a registered nurse		
12		in this State;		
13	(2)	An unencumbered license as a registered nurse in all		
14		other states in which the nurse has a current and		
15		active license;		
16	(3)	An unencumbered recognition as an advanced practice		
17		registered nurse or similar designation in all other		
18		states in which the nurse has a current and active		
19		recognition as an advanced practice registered nurse;		
20	(4)	Completed an accredited graduate-level education		
21		program [leading to a master's degree as a certified		
22		registered nurse anesthetist, a nurse midwife, a		

1		clinical nurse specialist, or a nurse practitioner;
2		preparing the nurse for one of the four recognized
3		advanced practice registered nurse roles;
4	(5)	A current, unencumbered certification of having passed
5		a national certification examination that measures
6		role and population-focused competencies and is
. 7		recognized by the board;
8	(6)	Maintained continued competencies through
9		recertification in role and population-focused
10		competencies through a national certification program
11		recognized by the board;
12	(7)	Acquired advanced clinical knowledge and skills
13		preparing the nurse to provide direct care to patients
14		through a significant educational and practical
15		concentration on the direct care of patients;
16	(8)	Demonstrated a greater breadth of knowledge, a greater
17		synthesis of data, greater complexity of skills and
18		interventions, and greater role autonomy than
19		demonstrated by a registered nurse;
20	(9)	Been educationally prepared to assume responsibility
21		and accountability for health promotion and
22		maintenance and to assess, diagnose, and manage

1		patient problems through the use and prescription of
2		pharmacologic and non-pharmacologic interventions;
3	(10)	Acquired clinical experience of sufficient depth and
4		breadth to reflect the intended license; and
5	(11)	Paid the appropriate fees."
6	SECT	ION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
7	and stric	ken. New statutory material is underscored.
8	SECT	ION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
