RELATING TO WAGES.

SB332 HD2 HMS 2013-3034

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to protect employees 2 in this State by requiring employers to keep accurate records of 3 employees' rates of pay and provide employees with specific wage 4 information on pay statements. 5 SECTION 2. Section 387-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended as follows: 6 7 1. By amending subsection (a) to read: 8 "(a) Every employer shall keep in or about the premises 9 wherein any employee is employed a contemporaneous, true, and 10 accurate record of [the]: The name, address, and occupation of each [such] 11 (1) 12 employee[, of the]; (2) The amount paid each pay period to each [such] 13 employee[, of the]; 14 The hours worked each day and each workweek by each 15 (3) [such] employee[, and of such]; 16 The rate or rates of pay of each employee and basis 17 (4) thereof, whether paid by the hour, shift, day, week, 18

1	salary, piece, commission, or other basis; gross		
2	wages; deductions; allowances, if any, claimed as part		
3	of the minimum wage; and net wages; and		
4	(5) Any other information and for [such] the periods of		
5	time as the director [of labor and industrial		
6	relations may by [regulation] rule prescribe.		
7	The director or the director's authorized representative		
8	shall for the purpose of examination have access to and the		
9	right to copy [from such] the records. Every employer shall		
10	furnish to the director or the director's authorized		
11	representative [such] any information relating to the employment		
12	of workers and in [such] any manner as the director may		
13	prescribe."		
14	2. By amending subsection (c) to read:		
15	"(c) Every employer shall furnish each employee at every		
16	pay period a legible printed, typewritten, or handwritten		
17	[notice] record showing the [employee's:] following:		
18	(1) The name of the employee;		
19	(2) The name of the employer;		
20	(3) The address and telephone number of the employer;		
21	[(1) Total] (4) The employee's total hours worked;		

1	[-(2)	Overtime] (5) The employee's regular and overtime
2		hours;
3	[(3)	Straight time] (6) The employee's straight-time
4		compensation;
5	[-(4)	Overtime [(7) The employee's overtime compensation;
6	[(5)	Other [+] (8) Any other compensation[+], including
7		allowances, if any, claimed as part of the minimum
8		wage;
9	[(6)	Total] (9) The employee's total gross compensation;
10	[(7)	Amount [(10) The amount and purpose of each
11		deduction;
12	[-(8) -	Total (11) The employee's total net compensation;
13	[(9)	Date] (12) The date of payment; [and
14	(10)	Pay] (13) The pay period covered; and
15	(14)	The rate or rates of pay and basis thereof, whether
16		paid by the hour, shift, day, week, salary, piece,
17		commission, or other basis, including overtime rate or
18		rates of pay. For employees paid a piece rate, the
19		record shall indicate the applicable piece rate or
20		rates of pay, and the number of pieces completed at
21		each piece rate;

- 1 provided that in lieu of the printed, typewritten, or
- 2 handwritten [notice] record required by this subsection and upon
- 3 receipt of written authorization from the employee, the employer
- 4 may provide an electronic [notice] record that may be
- 5 electronically accessed by the employee."
- 6 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 8 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2014.
