A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII HOME VISITING PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. On March 23, 2010, President Barack Obama
- 2 signed into law the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act
- 3 of 2010, also known as the Affordable Care Act (P.L. 111-148).
- The Affordable Care Act added section 511 to title V of the 4
- 5 Social Security Act to create the Maternal, Infant, and Early
- 6 Childhood Home Visiting Grant program to support development and
- implementation of evidence-based home visiting program models by 7
- 8 states and other eligible entities.
- 9 Home visiting is a prevention strategy used by states and
- communities to improve the health and well-being of women, 10
- 11 children, and families at risk for adverse health and safety
- 12 concerns, including child abuse and neglect. Early investments
- in home visiting programs have been shown to reduce costs 13
- 14 associated with foster care placements, hospitalizations,
- emergency room visits, unintended pregnancies, and other more 15
- 16 costly outcomes and interventions.

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1	The purpose of this Act is to establish a program within		
2	the department of health for hospital-based screening and home		
3	visiting services for newborns' families. Establishment of		
4	Hawaii's home visiting program will position the department of		
5	health to participate in the federal grant program, and thereby		
6	improve the health and safety of eligible families.		
7	SECTION 2. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
8	amended by adding a new section to part XXV to be appropriately		
9	designated and to read as follows:		
10	"§321- Hawaii home visiting program; established. (a)		
11	There is established within the department of health the Hawaii		
12	home visiting program, which shall be responsible for statewide		
13	hospital-based screening and home visiting services to identify		
14	families of newborns at risk for poor health and safety		
15	outcomes, including child abuse and neglect, to promote healthy		
16	child development and strengthen families.		
17	(b) Within the limits of available funds, the hospital-		
18	based screening and home visiting services program shall:		
19	(1) Provide proactive, universal screening of newborns'		
20	families, using one or more screening tools validated		
21	for identifying levels of risk for poor health and		

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1		safety outcomes and child abuse and neglect as
2		designated by the department of health;
3	(2)	Refer high-risk families to Hawaii home visiting
4	. •	program providers who shall employ evidence-based
5		models of service; and
6	<u>(3)</u>	Consider as a high priority, families at risk for poor
7		health outcomes, child abuse, or neglect."
8	SECT	ION 3. There is appropriated out of the Hawaii tobacco
9	settlemen	t special fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of
10	\$3,000,00	O or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
11	year 2012	-2013 to carry out the purposes of this Act.
12	The :	sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
13	health for	r the purposes of this Act.
14	SECT:	ION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
15	SECT	ION 5. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 2013.
