A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WASHINGTON PLACE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 26-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "\$26-6 Department of accounting and general services. The department of accounting and general services shall be 4 5 headed by a single executive to be known as the comptroller. 6 (b) The department shall: 7 (1) Preaudit and conduct after-the-fact audits of the 8 financial accounts of all state departments to determine the legality of expenditures and the 9 accuracy of accounts; 10 11 Report to the governor and to each regular session of (2) the legislature as to the finances of each department 12 13 of the State; Administer the state risk management program; 14 (3) 15 (4)Establish and manage motor pools; 16 (5) Manage the preservation and disposal of all records of the State; 17

1	(6)	Undertake the program of centralized engineering and
2		office leasing services, including operation and
3		maintenance of public buildings, for departments of
4		the State;
5	(7)	Undertake the functions of the state surveyor;
6	(8)	Establish accounting and internal control systems;
7	(9)	Provide centralized computer information management
8		and processing services, coordination in the use of
9		all information processing equipment, software,
10		facilities, and services in the executive branch of
11		the State, and consultation and support services in
12		the use of information processing and management
13		technologies to improve the efficiency, effectiveness,

15	(10)	Establish, coordinate, and manage a program to provide
16		a means for public access to public information and
17		develop and operate an information network in
18		conjunction with its overall plans for establishing a
19		communication backbone for state government.
20	(c)	The state communication system shall be established
21	to:	

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1	(1)	Facilitate implementation of the State's distributed
2		information processing and information resource
3		management plans;
4	(2)	Improve data, voice, and video communications in state
5		government;
6	(3)	Provide a means for connectivity among the state,
7		university, and county computer systems; and
8	(4)	Provide a long-term means for public access to public
9		information.
10	(d)	The department may adopt rules as may be necessary or
11	desirable	for the operation and maintenance of public buildings,
12	and for the	he operation and implementation of a program to provide
13	a means fo	or public access to the State's information network
14	system and	d public information. The rules shall be adopted
15	pursuant to chapter 91.	
16	(e)	The King Kamehameha celebration commission shall be
17	placed within the department of accounting and general services	
18	for admin	istrative purposes. The functions, duties, and powers,
19	subject to	o the administrative control of the comptroller, and
20	the compos	sition of the commission shall be as heretofore
21	provided 1	by law.

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1	(f) The functions and authority heretofore exercised by		
2	the comptroller, board of commissioners of public archives, the		
3	archivist, the disposal committee, and the insurance management,		
4	surplus property management, and central purchasing functions of		
5	the bureau of the budget and the nonhighway functions of the		
6	department of public works as heretofore constituted are		
.7	transferred to the department of accounting and general services		
8	established by this chapter.		
9	(g) The department of accounting and general services		
10	shall preserve and protect Washington Place, including the		
11	grounds and the historic residence situated on its premises at		
12	Miller and Beretania streets in Honolulu. The department shall		
13	administer, manage, operate, and maintain Washington Place and		
14	the trust fund created under subsection (h).		
15	(h) There is established a trust fund in the state		
16	treasury to be known as the Washington Place trust fund, into		
17	which shall be deposited:		
18	(1) All rents and fees collected for the use of Washington		
19	Place and from activities conducted on the premises;		
20	(2) All other money received for the fund from any other		
21	source; and		

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1	(3) All income and interest earned or accrued on moneys
2	deposited into the trust fund.
3	All moneys deposited into the trust fund shall be expended
4	by the department of accounting and general services and used
5	exclusively to implement the provisions of subsection (g),
6	including for staff salaries and fringe benefits, and shall not
7	be transferred, nor subject to transfer, to the general fund or
8	any other fund in the state treasury."
9.	SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.
10	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2013.
