A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CONTINUING EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the profession of
- 2 social workers has been regulated in the State since 1994.
- 3 Unlike other licensed professions, continuing education credit
- 4 hours are not currently required for social workers to renew
- 5 their licenses.
- 6 The legislature further finds that social workers provide
- 7 critically needed services in prevention, intervention, and
- 8 treatment to a broad spectrum of clients. It is therefore
- 9 essential that social workers maintain their professional
- 10 competency and keep abreast of the latest developments in their
- 11 profession. Requiring continuing education courses for social
- 12 workers who are renewing their licenses will give assurance to
- 13 Hawaii's consumers that social workers are current with the
- 14 latest developments in their field.
- 15 The purpose of this Act is to require licensed social
- 16 workers in Hawaii to:
- (1) Complete a minimum of fifteen credit hours of
- 18 continuing education courses for the licensing renewal

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1	period beginning July 1, 2013, through June 30, 2016;
2	and
3	(2) Complete a minimum of forty-five credit hours of
4	continuing education courses during each licensing
5	renewal period beginning July 1, 2016, and thereafter
6	SECTION 2. Section 467E-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7	amended by adding three new definitions to be appropriately
8	inserted and to read as follows:
9	""Continuing education courses" means courses approved by
10	the National Association of Social Workers, the National
11	Association of Social Workers Chapters, or the Association of
12	Social Work Boards.
13	"Credit hour" means, except as otherwise provided, the
14	value assigned to fifty minutes of instruction.
15	"Ethic courses" include ethic theory, ethical reasoning,
16	ethical principles, ethical dilemmas, and professional ethics."
17	SECTION 3. Section 467E-11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
18	amended to read as follows:
19	"[{]\$467E-11[}] Renewals. (a) Every license issued under
20	this chapter shall be renewed triennially on or before June 30,
21	with the first renewal deadline occurring on June 30, 1998.
22	Failure to renew a license shall result in a forfeiture of the
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1	license. Licenses which have been so forfeited may be restored		
2	within one year of the expiration date upon payment of renewal		
3	and penalty fees[-], and in the case of audited licensees,		
4	documentary proof of compliance of continuing education.		
5	Failure to restore a forfeited license within one year of the		
6	date of its expiration shall result in the automatic termination		
7	of the license and relicensure may be subject to the person		
8	applying as a new applicant and satisfying again all licensing		
9	requirements.		
10	(b) Beginning with the renewal for the licensing triennium		
11	commencing on July 1, 2013, through June 30, 2016, each licensee		
12	shall:		
13	(1) Pay all required fees; and		
14	(2) Complete a minimum of fifteen credit hours of		
15	continuing education courses within the renewal		
16	period; provided that a minimum of three credit hours		
17	shall be in ethic courses.		
18	(c) Beginning with the renewal for the licensing triennium		

commencing on July 1, 2016, through June 30, 2019, and prior to

every triennial renewal thereafter, each licensee shall:

(1) Pay all required fees; and

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1	(2)	Complete a minimum of forty-five credit hours of
2		continuing education courses within the three-year
3		period preceding the renewal date; provided that a
4		minimum of three credit hours shall be in ethic
5		courses.
6	(d)	A first time licensee shall not be subject to the
7	continuin	g education requirement for the first license renewal.
8	(e)	Each licensee shall maintain the licensee's continuing
9	education	records. At the time of renewal, each licensee shall
10	certify u	nder oath that the licensee has complied with the
11	continuin	g education requirement of this section. The director
12	may requi	re a licensee to submit evidence satisfactory to the
13	director	that demonstrates compliance with the continuing
14	education	requirement of this section.
15	(f)	The director may conduct random audits of licensees to
16	determine	compliance with the continuing education requirement.
17	The direc	tor shall provide written notice of an audit to a
18	licensee	randomly selected for audit. Within sixty days of
19	notificat	ion, the licensee shall provide the director with
20	documenta	tion verifying compliance with the continuing education
21	requireme	nt established by this section."

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1	SECTIO	N 4. Section 467E-12, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by	amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
3	" (a)	In addition to any other acts or conditions provided
4	by law, the	director may refuse to renew, reinstate, or restore,
5	or may deny	, revoke, suspend, or condition in any manner any
6	license, or	fine any exempt government employee for any one or
7	more of the	following acts or conditions on the part of the
8	applicant,	licensee, or exempt person:
9	(1) F	ailing to meet or maintain the conditions and
10	r	equirements necessary to qualify for the granting of
11	a	license;
12	(2) B	eing addicted to, dependent on, or being a habitual
13	u	ser of a narcotic, barbiturate, amphetamine,
14	h	allucinogen, opium, or cocaine, or other drugs or
15	đ	erivatives of a similar nature;
16	(3) E	ngaging in the practice of social work while impaired
17	b	y alcohol, drugs, or mental instability;
18	(4) P	rocuring a social work license through fraud,
19	m	isrepresentation, or deceit;
20	(5) A	iding and abetting an unlicensed person to directly
21	0	r indirectly use the title "social worker" or engage
22	<u>1</u> .	n practice as a "licensed bachelor social worker",

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1		"licensed social worker", or "licensed clinical social
2		worker";
3	(6)	Engaging in professional misconduct, incompetence,
4		gross negligence, or manifest incapacity in the
5		practice of social work;
6	(7)	Engaging in conduct or practice contrary to recognized
7		standards of ethics for the social work profession;
8	(8)	Failing to comply, observe, or adhere to any law in a
9		manner such that the director deems the applicant or
10		holder to be an unfit or improper person to hold a
11		social work license;
12	(9)	Revocation, suspension, or other disciplinary action
13		by another state or federal agency against a licensee
14		or applicant for any reason provided by this section;
15	(10)	Having a criminal conviction, whether by nolo
16		contendere or otherwise, of a crime directly related
17		to the qualifications, functions, or duties of the
18		social work profession;
19	(11)	Failing to report in writing to the director any
20		disciplinary decision issued against the licensee or
21		the applicant in another jurisdiction within thirty
22		days of the disciplinary decision;

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1	(12)	Employing, utilizing, or attempting to employ or
2		utilize at any time any person not licensed under this
3		chapter who purports to be or engages in practice as a
4		social worker, licensed bachelor social worker,
5		licensed social worker, or licensed clinical social
6		worker;
7	(13)	Engaging in the practice of social work beyond the
8		scope of the person's license; [er]
9	(14)	Making a false statement on any document submitted or
10		required to be filed by this chapter, including a
11		false certification of compliance with the continuing
12		education requirement; or
13	[(14)]	(15) Violating this chapter or any rules adopted
14		pursuant thereto."
15	SECT	ION 5. The director of commerce and consumer affairs
16	shall pro	vide written notice of the contents of this Act to all
17	persons 1	icensed under chapter 467E, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
18	within ni	nety days of the effective date of this Act.
19	SECT	ION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
20	and strick	ken. New statutory material is underscored.
21	SECT:	ION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
