ACT 209 S.B. NO. S.D. 1 H.D. 2 C.D. 1

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ANIMALS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that persons who are
- 2 cruel to one animal may commit cruel acts to other animals and,
- 3 as such, it is necessary to ensure that persons convicted of
- 4 cruelty to animals are restricted from owning and possessing
- 5 additional animals for a period of time.
- 6 Act 262, Session Laws of Hawaii 1985, relating to
- 7 forfeiture of animals for cruelty to animals (enacted as section
- 8 711-1110.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes), provides in pertinent part
- 9 that the court may order the defendant to surrender or forfeit
- 10 the animal whose treatment was the basis of the conviction or
- 11 plea, as well as any other animals under the possession,
- 12 custody, or control of the defendant, to the custody of a duly
- 13 incorporated humane society or duly incorporated society for the
- 14 prevention of cruelty to animals. The intent of Act 262 is to
- 15 temporarily protect abused animals from further harm.
- 16 Notwithstanding Act 262, there have been numerous instances
- 17 where defendants who have been convicted of a cruelty to animals
- 18 offense, in some cases involving dozens of animals, have been

- 1 allowed to continue to own animals and to sometimes sell the
- 2 animals for profit.
- 3 More than thirty states have enacted laws to prohibit the
- 4 possession of, owning of, or residing with animals upon
- 5 conviction of a cruelty to animals offense.
- 6 The purpose of this Act is to prohibit any person convicted
- 7 of cruelty to animals in the first degree from possessing or
- 8 owning any pet animal and equine animal for a minimum of five
- 9 years from the date of conviction.
- 10 SECTION 2. Section 711-1108.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended by amending subsection (5) to read as follows:
- 12 "(5) Cruelty to animals in the first degree is a class C
- 13 felony. In addition to any fines and imprisonment imposed under
- 14 this section, any person convicted under this section shall be
- 15 prohibited from possessing or owning any pet animal or equine
- 16 animal for a minimum of five years from the date of conviction.
- 17 For the purposes of this section, "person" means any
- 18 individual; any firm, partnership, joint venture, association,
- 19 limited liability company, corporation, estate, trust, receiver,
- 20 or syndicate; or any other legal entity."

- 1 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 2 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 3 begun before its effective date.
- 4 SECTION 4. If any provision of this Act, or the
- 5 application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held
- 6 invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
- 7 applications of the Act that can be given effect without the
- 8 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
- 9 of this Act are severable.
- 10 SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.
- 11 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
