## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SIMULATED FIREARMS.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Section 707-716, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by	y amending subsection (1) to read as follows:
3	"(1)	A person commits the offense of terroristic
4	threateni	ng in the first degree if the person commits
5	terrorist	ic threatening:
6	(a)	By threatening another person on more than one
7		occasion for the same or a similar purpose;
8	(b)	By threats made in a common scheme against different
9		persons;
10	(c)	Against a public servant arising out of the
11		performance of the public servant's official duties.
12		For the purposes of this paragraph, "public servant"
13		includes but is not limited to an educational worker.
14		"Educational worker" has the same meaning as defined
15		in section 707-711;
16	(d)	Against any emergency medical services provider who is
17		engaged in the performance of duty. For purposes of
18		this paragraph, "emergency medical services provider"

1		means emergency medical services personnel, as defined										
2		in section 321-222, and physicians, physician's										
3		assistants, nurses, nurse practitioners, certified										
4	registered nurse anesthetists, respiratory therapists,											
, 5		laboratory technicians, radiology technicians, and										
6		social workers, providing services in the emergency										
7		room of a hospital;										
8	(e)	(e) With the use of a dangerous instrument $[+]$ or $\underline{a}$										
9	simulated firearm. For purposes of this section,											
10	"simulated firearm" means any object that:											
11		(i) Substantially resembles a firearm;										
12		(ii) Can reasonably be perceived to be a firearm; or										
13	. <u>.</u>	iii) Is used or brandished as a firearm; or										
14	(f)	By threatening a person who:										
15		(i) The defendant has been restrained from, by order										
16		of any court, including an ex parte order,										
17		contacting, threatening, or physically abusing										
18		pursuant to chapter 586; or										
19	•	ii) Is being protected by a police officer ordering										
20		the defendant to leave the premises of that										
21		protected person pursuant to section 709-906(4),										
22		during the effective period of that order."										

1	SECT	ION 2. Section 708-840, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is.
2	amended by	amending subsections (1) and (2) to read as follows:
3	"(1)	A person commits the offense of robbery in the first
4	degree if	in the course of committing theft or non-consensual
5	taking of	a motor vehicle:
6	(a)	The person attempts to kill another or intentionally
7		or knowingly inflicts or attempts to inflict serious
8		bodily injury upon another;
9	(b)	The person is armed with a dangerous instrument or a
10		simulated firearm and:
11		(i) The person uses force against the person of
12		anyone present with intent to overcome that
13		person's physical resistance or physical power of
14		resistance; or
15		(ii) The person threatens the imminent use of force
16		against the person of anyone present with intent
17		to compel acquiescence to the taking of or
18		escaping with the property;
19	(c)	The person uses force against the person of anyone
20		present with the intent to overcome that person's
21		physical resistance or physical power of resistance

during the time of a civil defense emergency

1		proclaimed by the governor pursuant to chapter 128,					
2		within the area covered by the civil defense emergency					
3		or during the period of disaster relief under chapter					
4		127; or					
5	(d)	The person threatens the imminent use of force against					
6		the person of anyone present with intent to compel					
7		acquiescence to the taking of or escaping with the					
8		property during the time of a civil defense emergency					
9		proclaimed by the governor pursuant to chapter 128,					
10		within the area covered by the civil defense emergency					
11		or during the period of disaster relief under chapter					
12		127.					
13	(2)	As used in this section[ - "dangerous instrument"]:					
14	"Dan	gerous instrument" means any firearm, whether loaded or					
15	not, and whether operable or not, or other weapon, device,						
16	instrument, material, or substance, whether animate or						
17	inanimate, which in the manner it is used or threatened to be						
18	used is c	apable of producing death or serious bodily injury.					
19	"Sim	ulated firearm" means any object that:					
20	<u>(a)</u>	Substantially resembles a firearm;					
21	<u>(b)</u>	Can reasonably be perceived to be a firearm; or					
22	<u>(c)</u>	Is used or brandished as a firearm."
