Dear President Kim, Speaker Souki, and Members of the Legislature:

Re: House Bill No. 1130, H.D. 1, S.D. 1

House Bill No. 1130, H.D. 1, S.D. 1, entitled "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE HAWAII HEALTH SYSTEMS CORPORATION" will become law without my signature, pursuant to Section 16 of Article III of the State Constitution.

The purpose of this bill is to expand and diversify the membership of the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation Board of Directors.

This bill will improve accountability in the management of the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation, create a more balanced multi-board tiered system, and help address the challenges facing the health care system. Additionally, this bill will allow the Corporation to reposition its health care services in accordance with health care transformation. However, I am concerned about the current financial situation of the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation and will ask the Board of Directors to address its long term sustainability.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII HEALTH SYSTEMS CORPORATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The Hawaii health systems corporation, the
2	fourth largest public hospital system in the nation, operates
3	public health care facilities that provide essential safety-net
4	hospital and long-term care services throughout the State. The
5	legislature finds that changes in the health care industry and
6	implementation of national health care reform necessitate that
7	the Hawaii health systems corporation board of directors have
8	the necessary flexibility and autonomy needed for community
9	hospitals to compete and remain viable.
10	The Hawaii health systems corporation board currently
11	includes five regional chief executive officers who serve as ex-
12	officio, voting members. The regional chief executive officers
13	have been instrumental in bringing additional expertise to the
14	board during its time of transition from a single corporation
15	board to a multi-level board. In light of the successful
16	establishment of the regional system boards, the significant
17	challenges imposed by an ever-changing and complex health care
18	environment, the time required to serve on the Hawaii health



- 1 systems corporation board, and the desire for additional
- 2 community participation, the legislature finds it appropriate to
- 3 shift the voting powers of the five regional chief executive
- 4 officers on the board to the community members from each of the
- 5 regional systems. The regional chief executive officers will
- 6 continue to participate in the Hawaii health systems
- 7 corporation's board meetings, along with the Hawaii health
- 8 systems corporation president and chief executive officer.
- 9 The legislature finds that the statewide nature and
- 10 function of the Hawaii health systems corporation are essential
- 11 for coordination of decisions and are necessary to provide a
- 12 centralized system of operations, budgeting, and planning for
- 13 public healthcare in the State. As a statewide governing
- 14 entity, the Hawaii health systems corporation is able to make
- 15 decisions from a statewide perspective to minimize costs and
- 16 maximize efficiencies in healthcare provision through economies
- 17 of scale. The Hawaii health systems corporation's role and
- 18 function ensure coordination and consolidation of services among
- 19 public hospitals in areas such as facilities management, capital
- 20 planning, purchasing, personnel, and public-private partnerships
- 21 for the needs of communities statewide.

1	The purpose of this Act is to improve accountability in the
2	health care system, support clear and consistent roles for all
3	regional systems, and create a more balanced multi-board tiered
4	system by shifting the voting powers of the five regional chief
5	executive officers on the Hawaii health systems corporation
6	board of directors to community members who are appointed by the
7	governor.
8	SECTION 2. Section 323F-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9	amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows:
10	"(a) The corporation shall be governed by [a thirteen
11	member] an eighteen-member board of directors that shall carry
12	out the duties and responsibilities of the corporation other
13	than those duties and responsibilities relating to the
14	establishment of any captive insurance company pursuant to
15	section 323F-7(c)(20) and the operation thereof.
16	(b) The members of the corporation board shall be
17	appointed as follows:
18	(1) The director of health as an ex-officio, voting
19	member;
20	(2) The five regional chief executive officers as ex-
21	officio, [voting] nonvoting members;

1	(3)	[Two] Three members who reside in the county of Maui
2		[who], two of whom shall be appointed by the Maui
3		regional system board[+] and one of whom shall be
4		appointed by the governor, all of whom shall serve as
5		voting members;
6	(4)	[One member] Two members who [resides] reside in the
7		eastern section of the county of Hawaii [who], one of
8		whom shall be appointed by the East Hawaii regional
9		system board[+] and one of whom shall be appointed by
10		the governor, both of whom shall serve as voting
11		members;
12	(5)	[One-member] Two members who [resides] reside in the
13		western section of the county of Hawaii [who], one of
14		whom shall be appointed by the West Hawaii regional
15		system board[+] and one of whom shall be appointed by
16		the governor, both of whom shall serve as voting
17		members;
18	(6)	[One-member] Two members who [resides] reside on the
19		island of Kauai [who], one of whom shall be appointed
20		by the Kauai regional system board[+] and one of whom
21	-	shall be appointed by the governor, both of whom shall
22		serve as voting members;

1	(/) [the member] Two members who [resides] reside on the
2	island of Oahu [who], one of whom shall be appointed
3	by the Oahu regional system board[+] and one of whom
4	shall be appointed by the governor, both of whom shall
5	serve as voting members; and
6	(8) One member who shall be appointed by the governor and
7	serve as an at-large voting member.
8	The appointed board members who reside in the county of
9	Maui, eastern section of the county of Hawaii, western section
10	of the county of Hawaii, on the island of Kauai, and on the
11	island of Oahu shall each serve for a term of four years;
12	provided that the terms of the initial appointments of the
13	members who are appointed by their respective regional system
14	boards shall be as follows: one of the initial members from the
15	county of Maui shall be appointed to serve a term of two years
16	and the other member shall be appointed to serve a term of four
17	years; the initial member from East Hawaii shall be appointed to
18	serve a term of two years; the initial member from West Hawaii
19	shall be appointed to serve a term of four years; the initial
20	member from the island of Kauai shall be appointed to serve a
21	term of two years; and the initial member from the island of
22	Oahu shall be appointed to serve a term of four years [-] ; and

- 1 provided further that the terms of the initial appointments of
- 2 the members who are appointed by the governor shall be four
- 3 years. The at-large member appointed by the governor shall
- 4 serve a term of two years.
- 5 Any vacancy shall be filled in the same manner provided for
- 6 the original appointments. The corporation board shall elect
- 7 its own chair from among its members. Appointments to the
- 8 corporation board shall be as representative as possible of the
- 9 system's stakeholders as outlined in this subsection. The board
- 10 member appointments shall strive to create a board that includes
- 11 expertise in the fields of medicine, finance, health care
- 12 administration, government affairs, human resources, and law."
- 13 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 15 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
