
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TUITION WAIVERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by adding a new section to part II to be appropriately
3 designated and to read as follows:

4 "§304A- Tuition waivers; spouses and children of

5 eligible veterans. (a) The University of Hawaii and the

6 community colleges of the State may waive tuition for any

7 qualified student who is a spouse or child of:

8 (1) A totally disabled veteran; or

9 (2) An eligible veteran or national guard member who lost

10 his or her life while engaged in active federal

11 military or naval service; provided that upon

12 remarriage, the surviving spouse of the eligible

13 veteran or national guard member shall no longer be

14 eligible for the tuition waiver under this section.

15 (b) For purposes of this section:

16 "Eligible veteran or national guard member" means a Hawaii

17 domiciliary who was an active or reserve member of the United

18 states military or naval forces, or a national guard member



1 called to active duty, who served in the active federal service
 2 under title 10 or title 32 of the United States Code, in a war
 3 or conflict fought on foreign soil, in international waters, or
 4 in another location in support of those serving on foreign soil
 5 or in international waters, and if discharged from service, had
 6 received an honorable discharge.

7 "Totally disabled veteran" means a person who is totally
 8 disabled due to injuries received while on duty with the armed
 9 forces of the United States.

10 (c) The University of Hawaii may adopt rules pursuant to
 11 chapter 91 to implement this section."

12 SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.

13 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
