A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HUMAN TRAFFICKING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 371, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§371- National Human Trafficking Resource Center
5	hotline; posting requirement; penalty. (a) Every employer
6	shall post and keep posted in a conspicuous place in every
7	establishment where any employee is employed so as to permit the
8	employee to observe readily on the way to or from the employee's
9	place of employment, a poster no smaller than eight and one-half
10	inches by eleven inches in size that states the following:
11	"If you or someone you know is being forced to engage in
12	any activity and cannot leave - whether it is commercial
13	sex, housework, farm work, or any other similar activity -
14	call the National Human Trafficking Resource Center Hotline
15	at 1-888-373-7888 to access help and services.
16	Victims of human trafficking are protected under United
17	States and Hawaii law.

The hotline is:



- 1 Available twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week; (1)2 (2) Toll free; 3 Operated by a non-profit, non-governmental (3) 4 organization; 5 Anonymous and confidential; (4)6 (5) Accessible in one hundred seventy languages; and 7 (6) Able to provide help, referral to services, training, and general information." 8 9 (b) A poster required under subsection (a) shall be 10 printed in English and the director may supplement the required 11 information. 12 (c) The department shall make available on its public website an electronic version of the poster required by 13 14 subsection (a) for employers to print. 15 (d) Any employer who wilfully and knowingly fails, neglects, or refuses to perform any act required by this section 16 17 shall be fined not more than \$100 for each separate offense. 18 Each day the violation continues shall constitute a separate 19 offense. Any action taken to impose or collect the penalty provided for in this subsection shall be considered a civil 20 21 action." 22 SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.
