## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the department of
- 2 health and the department of human services are responsible for
- 3 licensing, certifying, and monitoring several types of care
- 4 facilities. Although the departments perform inspections to
- 5 ensure a certain standard of quality for facilities that use
- 6 state moneys, the public currently cannot easily access the
- 7 information contained in the inspection reports. The
- 8 legislature finds that the public would benefit from greater
- 9 access to information on the quality and conditions of care
- 10 facilities in Hawaii.
- 11 The purpose of this Act is to allow the department of
- 12 health and the department of human services to make available to
- 13 the public, information collected from the departments'
- 14 inspections of certain care facilities in which a major patient
- 15 care related violation was discovered.
- 16 SECTION 2. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 17 amended by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately
- 18 designated and to read as follows:

13	(5)	A special treatment facility as defined in section	
14		334-1.	
15	<u>(b)</u>	Information may be posted on the department of	
16	<u>health's</u>	website within days after the order specifying	
17	the major	patient care violation became final and shall include	
18	but not b	e limited to the following information:	
19	(1)	The date that the order specifying the major patient	
20		<pre>care violation became final;</pre>	
21	(2)	A description of violations of relevant state laws or	
22		rules; and	

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1	(3) Plans of correction and the status of corrective
2	actions in response to any major patient care
3	violations.
4	(c) For purposes of this section "major patient care
5	violation" means any violation in which there is gross
6	negligence, wilful and wanton misconduct, or intentional
7	misconduct, including financial abuse."
8	SECTION 3. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9	amended by adding a new section to part XIV to be appropriately
10	designated and to read as follows:
11	"§346- Inspections; public notice. (a) Beginning on
12	January 1, 2015, the department of human services may post on
13	its website information concerning a major patient care
14	violation when the order specifying the violation is final and
15	discovered in an adult day care center or community care foster

7	(1)	Is regulated by the department in accordance with
8		rules that are equitable in relation to rules that
9		<pre>govern expanded adult residential care homes;</pre>
10	(2)	Is issued a certificate of approval by the department
11		or its designee to provide, for a fee, twenty-four-
12		hour living accommodations, including personal care
13		and homemaker services, for not more than two adults
14		at any one time, at least one of whom shall be a
15		medicaid recipient, who are at the nursing facility
16		level of care, who are unrelated to the foster family,
17		and who are receiving the services of a licensed home
18		and community-based case management agency; provided
19		that the department, in its discretion, may certify a
20		home for a third adult who is at the nursing level of
21		care and a medicaid recipient; provided that the:

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1	(A)	Home has been certified and in operation for not
2		less than one year;
3	<u>(B)</u>	Primary caregiver is a certified nurse aide, as
4		defined in section 457A-1.5, who has completed a
5		state-approved training program and other
6		training as required by the department; and
7	<u>(C)</u>	Substitute caregiver is a nurse aide, as defined
8		in section 457A-1.5, who has completed a state-
9		approved training program and other training as
10		required by the department; and
11	<u>(3)</u> <u>Does</u>	not include expanded adult residential care homes
12	<u>or a</u>	ssisted living facilities, which shall continue to
13	be 1	icensed by the department of health.
14	"Major pa	tient care violation" means any violation in which
15	there is gross	negligence, wilful and wanton misconduct, or
16	intentional mi	sconduct, including financial abuse."
17	SECTION 4	. New statutory material is underscored.
18	SECTION 5	. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

### Report Title:

Care Facility Violations; Posting on Websites; DOH; DHS

#### Description:

Allows the Department of Health and the Department of Human Services to post on their respective websites information of all inspections in which major patient care violations were discovered at certain care facilities and the order specifying the violation is final. Effective July 1, 2050. (HB120 HD2)
