
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PERSONAL INFORMATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 487J-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

3 "(a) No business may scan the machine-readable zone of an
4 individual's Hawaii identification card or driver's license,
5 except for the following purposes:

6 (1) To verify authenticity of the identification card or
7 driver's license or to verify the identity of the
8 individual if the individual pays for goods or
9 services with a method other than cash, returns an
10 item, or requests a refund or an exchange;

11 (2) To verify the individual's age when providing age-
12 restricted goods or services to the individual [~~if~~
13 ~~there is a reasonable doubt of the individual having~~
14 ~~reached eighteen years of age or older~~];

15 (3) To prevent fraud or other criminal activity if the
16 individual returns an item or requests a refund or an
17 exchange and the business uses a fraud prevention
18 service company or system. Information collected by



1 scanning an individual's Hawaii identification card or
2 driver's license pursuant to this subsection shall be
3 limited to the following information from the
4 individual:

- 5 (A) Name;
- 6 (B) Address;
- 7 (C) Date of birth; and
- 8 (D) Driver's license number or identification card
9 number;

10 (4) To establish or maintain a contractual relationship.
11 Information collected by scanning the individual's
12 Hawaii identification card or driver's license
13 pursuant to this subsection shall be limited to the
14 following information from the individual:

- 15 (A) Name;
- 16 (B) Address;
- 17 (C) Date of birth; and
- 18 (D) Driver's license number or identification card
19 number;

20 (5) To record, retain, or transmit information as required
21 by state or federal law;

1 (6) To transmit information to a consumer reporting
2 agency, financial institution, or debt collector to be
3 used as permitted by the federal Fair Credit Reporting
4 Act, Gramm-Leach-Bliley Act, or the Fair Debt
5 Collection Practices Act; and

6 (7) To record, retain, or transmit information by a
7 covered entity governed by the medical privacy and
8 security rules issued by the federal Department of
9 Health and Human Services, Parts 160 and 164 of Title
10 45 the Code of Federal Regulations, established
11 pursuant to the Health Insurance Portability and
12 [~~Availability~~] Accountability Act of 1996."

13 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

15 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2100.

ID Card; Driver's License

Description:

Allows a business to scan an individual's driver's license or identification card to verify age when providing age-restricted goods or services regardless of reasonable doubt of the person's age. Effective January 1, 2100. (HB1287 HD1)
