
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROFESSIONAL AND VOCATIONAL LICENSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Act 248, Session Laws of Hawaii 2012, is
2 amended by amending section 1 to read as follows:

3 "SECTION 1. Chapter 436B, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4 amended by adding a new section to read as follows:

5 "~~§436B-~~ Licensure[+] by endorsement or licensure by
6 reciprocity; acceptance of military education, training, or
7 service. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, every
8 licensing authority subject to this chapter, upon presentation
9 of satisfactory evidence by an applicant[+] for licensure by
10 endorsement or licensure by reciprocity, shall consider relevant
11 education, training, licensure examinations, or service
12 completed by [am]:

13 (1) A nonresident military spouse; or

14 (2) An individual as a member of the armed forces or
15 reserves of the United States, the national guard of
16 any state, the military reserves of any state, or the
17 navy militia of any state; provided that the
18 individual, and not the military spouse, shall:



1 (A) Have served in a combat zone after September 11,
2 2001; and

3 (B) Provide a copy of the individual's most recent
4 retirement, separation, or discharge document
5 that indicates an honorable discharge or general
6 (under honorable conditions) discharge from
7 active duty;


8 as part of the evaluation process toward the qualification
9 requirements to receive the license. Evidence presented for
10 consideration for fulfillment or partial fulfillment of
11 licensing requirements shall demonstrate substantial equivalency
12 to state standards."

13 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

15 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Report Title:

Licensure; Veterans; Nonresident Military Spouses; Endorsement; Reciprocity

Description:

Requires a licensing authority to consider in the process for licensure by endorsement or reciprocity nonresident military spouses or service members who have served in a combat zone after September 11, 2001, and service members who provide retirement, separation, or discharge documentation.
