A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROFESSIONAL AND VOCATIONAL LICENSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 436B-14.7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending its title and subsection (a) to read as
3	follows:
4	"[$\{\}$ \$436B-14.7[$\}$] Licensure by endorsement or licensure by
5	reciprocity; initial acceptance by affidavit; temporary license.
6	(a) If a nonresident military spouse holds a current license in
7	another state, district, or territory of the United States with
8	licensure requirements that the licensing authority determines
9	are equivalent to or exceed those established by the licensing
10	authority of this State, that nonresident military spouse shall
11	receive a license pursuant to applicable statutes or
12	requirements of the licensing authority of this State regarding
13	licensure by endorsement or licensure by reciprocity; provided
14	that the nonresident military spouse:
15	(1) Has not committed an act in any jurisdiction that
16	would have constituted grounds for the limitation,
17	suspension, or revocation of a license; has never been

censured or had other disciplinary action taken; has

1		not had an application for licensure denied; or has
2		not refused to practice a profession or vocation for
3		which the nonresident military spouse seeks licensure;
4	(2)	Has not been disciplined by a licensing or
5		credentialing entity in another jurisdiction; is not
6	•	the subject of an unresolved complaint, review
7		procedure, or disciplinary proceeding conducted by a
8		licensing or credentialing entity in another
9		jurisdiction; and has not surrendered membership on
10		any professional staff in any professional
11		association, society, or faculty for another state or
12		licensing jurisdiction while under investigation or to
13		avoid adverse action for acts or conduct similar to
14		acts or conduct which would constitute grounds for
15		disciplinary action in this State;
16	(3)	Pays any fees required by the licensing authority of
17		this State; [and]
18	(4)	Submits with the application a signed affidavit
19		stating that application information, including
20		necessary prior employment history, is true and
21		accurate. Upon receiving the affidavit, the licensing
22		authority shall issue the license to the nonresident

1		military spouse and may revoke the license at any time
2		if the information provided in the application is
3		found to be false[-]; and
4	(5)	Is the spouse of a military member who is a member in
5		good standing in the active or a reserve component of
6		any of the armed forces of the United States and has
7		orders issued by the United States Department of
8		Defense to be stationed in Hawaii for a duration of at
9		least one year."

11	amended b	y amending section 1 to read as follows:

the military reserves of any state, or the navy militia of any
state; provided that the individual shall:
(A) Have been given an honorable discharge or general
(under honorable conditions) discharge from active
duty within two years of applying for licensure by
endorsement or licensure by reciprocity; and
(B) Provide a copy of the individual's most recent
retirement, separation, or discharge document that
indicates an honorable discharge or general (under
honorable conditions) discharge from active duty;
as part of the evaluation process toward the qualification
requirements to receive the license. Evidence presented for
consideration for fulfillment or partial fulfillment of
licensing requirements shall demonstrate substantial equivalency
to state standards. The requirements of this section shall not
be applicable to applications for licensure of medical doctors,
dentists, certified public accountants, or by a licensing
authority that is subject to specific provisions regulating
licensure by endorsement or licensure by reciprocity pursuant to
another chapter."

Report Title:

Licensure; Veterans; Nonresident Military Spouses; Endorsement; Reciprocity

Description:

Limits licensure by endorsement or reciprocity for nonresident military spouses to those spouses who are present in the State for at least one year pursuant to DOD orders. Limits consideration of military service or training for licensure by endorsement or reciprocity to veterans honorably discharged within two years of application and excludes medical doctors, dentists, CPAs, and other licencees for which specified endorsement or reciprocity regulations exist. Effective July 1, 2112. (HB1381 HD2)
