A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE BUDGET OF THE OFFICE OF HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds
 for the biennial budget of the office of Hawaiian affairs. This
 Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Office of Hawaiian
 Affairs Appropriations Act of 2013".

5 SECTION 2. Unless otherwise clear from the context, as
6 used in this Act:

7 "Means of financing", or "MOF", means the source from which 8 funds are appropriated or authorized, as the case may be, to be 9 expended for the programs and projects specified in this Act. 10 Letter symbols following appropriations have the following 11 meanings:

A: General Funds

13 T: Trust Funds

14 "Position ceiling" means the maximum number of permanent 15 positions authorized for a particular program during a specified 16 period or periods, as noted by an asterisk.

17 "Program ID" means the unique identifier of the specific
18 program, and consists of the abbreviation for the office of HB222 HD2 FIN 2013



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Hawaiian affairs followed by a designated number for the
 program.

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3 SECTION 3. The following sums, or so much thereof as may 4 be necessary to accomplish the purposes and programs designated 5 herein, are appropriated or authorized, as the case may be, from 6 the sources of funding specified to the office of Hawaiian 7 affairs for the fiscal biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and 8 ending June 30, 2015. The total general fund expenditures and 9 the number of permanent positions established in each fiscal 10 year of the biennium shall not exceed the sums and the position 11 ceilings indicated for each year, except as provided elsewhere 12 in this Act.

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SECTION 4. Provided that the general fund appropriations
 in section 3 of this Act shall be expended by the office of
 Hawaiian affairs.

4 SECTION 5. Provided that of the funds appropriated for 5 beneficiary advocacy (OHA 175), the sum of \$400,000 in general 6 funds and \$400,000 in trust funds for fiscal year 2013-2014 and 7 the sum of \$400,000 in general funds and \$400,000 in trust funds 8 for fiscal year 2014-2015 shall provide for social services to 9 office of Hawaiian affairs beneficiaries to include information 10 and referral services, case management and counseling, 11 establishment of individual development accounts, financial 12 literacy training, and financial assistance. Referral services 13 include those relating to education assistance, employment and 14 income security, individual and family care, health needs, 15 housing, legal services, genealogy research, business 16 assistance, and general information; provided further that 17 notwithstanding section 10-17(e), Hawaii Revised Statutes, any 18 funds expended for the purposes of this section shall be in 19 accordance with chapter 103D or 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, 20 as appropriate.

21 SECTION 6. Provided that of the funds appropriated for
22 beneficiary advocacy (OHA 175), the sum of \$750,000 in general



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1 funds and \$750,000 in trust funds for fiscal year 2013-2014 and the sum of \$750,000 in general funds and \$750,000 in trust funds 2 3 for fiscal year 2014-2015 shall provide for educational 4 enrichment programs for Native Hawaiian children in grades K through 12 throughout the State. Program activities are to be 5 6 designed to optimize learning for Hawaiian students and are 7 intended to develop a stronger interest in learning, connect 8 learning and education to the students' Hawaiian identity, and 9 explore possible educational, career, and academic goals the students may not have considered; provided further that 10 notwithstanding section 10-17(e), Hawaii Revised Statutes, 11 12 expenditure of any funds for the purposes of this section shall 13 be made in accordance with chapter 103D or 103F, Hawaii Revised 14 Statutes, or a competitive grants process, as appropriate.

15 SECTION 7. Provided that of the funds appropriated for 16 beneficiary advocacy (OHA 175), the sum of \$524,400 in general 17 funds and \$524,400 in trust funds for fiscal year 2013-2014 and 18 the sum of \$524,400 in general funds and \$524,400 in trust funds 19 for fiscal year 2014-2015 shall provide for legal services and 20 legal representation to office of Hawaiian affairs beneficiaries for: the assertion and defense of quiet title actions; 21 22 assistance with ahupua'a and kuleana tenant rights, including



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rights of access and rights to water, land title assistance, 1 including review of title and genealogy, preservation of 2 3 traditional and customary practices, protection of culturally 4 significant places, and preservation of Native Hawaiian land 5 trust entitlements; provided further that notwithstanding 6 section 10-17(e), Hawaii Revised Statutes, expenditure of any 7 funds expended for the purposes of this section shall be made in 8 accordance with chapter 103D or 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, 9 as appropriate.

10 SECTION 8. Provided that of the funds appropriated for 11 beneficiary advocacy (OHA 175), the sum of \$750,000 in general 12 funds and \$750,000 in trust funds for fiscal year 2013-2014 and 13 the sum of \$750,000 in general funds and \$750,000 in trust funds 14 for fiscal year 2014-2015 shall provide for health improvement 15 services to office of Hawaiian affairs beneficiaries, to 16 include, but not necessarily be limited to, information and 17 referral services, case management and counseling, and the 18 establishment of prevention programs. Direct services and 19 prevention programs include those designed to have the greatest 20 statewide impact on the overall wellness of Native Hawaiians 21 through targeted foci on the reduction of Native Hawaiian chronic diseases rates, especially obesity. Through both 22



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prevention programs and direct services, significant gains could
 be made for the most vulnerable and highest risk Native
 Hawaiians; provided further that notwithstanding section 10 17(e), Hawaii Revised Statutes, expenditure of any funds
 expended for the purposes of this section shall be made in
 accordance with chapter 103D or 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
 or a competitive grants process, as appropriate.

8 SECTION 9. Provided that of the funds appropriated for 9 beneficiary advocacy (OHA 175), the sum of \$250,000 in general 10 funds and \$250,000 in trust funds for fiscal year 2013-2014 and 11 the sum of \$250,000 in general funds and \$250,000 in trust funds 12 for fiscal year 2014-2015 shall provide leverage funding to the office of Hawaiian affairs on behalf of its beneficiaries for 13 14 partnership with other entities and organizations on projects in 15 support of Kahua Waiwai (Economic Self Sufficiency), 'Aina (Land 16 & Water), Mauli Ola (Health), Ke Ea (Governance), and Ho'ona'auao 17 (Education); provided further that notwithstanding section 10-18 17(e), Hawaii Revised Statutes, any funds expended for the 19 purposes of this section shall be made in accordance with 20 chapter 103D or 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, or a grants 21 process, as appropriate.



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1 SECTION 10. Provided that whenever necessary, the board of 2 trustees of the office of Hawaiian affairs or the board's 3 designee is authorized to transfer sufficient funds and 4 positions between programs for operating purposes; provided 5 further that these transfers shall not be inconsistent with legislative intent; provided further that a report of these fund 6 7 transfers shall be made to the legislature no later than the end 8 of the 2014 and 2015 fiscal years.

9 SECTION 11. If any portion of this Act or its application 10 to any person or circumstances is held to be invalid for any 11 reason, the remainder of the Act and any provision thereof shall 12 not be affected. If any portion of a specific appropriation is 13 held to be invalid for any reason, the remaining portion shall 14 be independent of the invalid portion and shall be expended to 15 fulfill the objective and intent of the appropriation to the 16 extent possible.

SECTION 12. In the event manifest clerical, typographical, or other mechanical errors are found in this Act, the board of trustees of the office of Hawaiian affairs may correct such errors. All changes made pursuant to this section shall be reported to the legislature at its next session.

22 SECTION 13. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2013.23
