A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CONDOMINIUMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that mediation is an
 informal, inexpensive, and confidential process for resolving
 disputes quickly. Mediation may be particularly advantageous in
 a condominium setting because of the potential to preserve or to
 restore harmony within a condominium community.

6 The legislature further finds that fees paid into the 7 condominium education trust fund come entirely from condominium 8 owners. Dedicating a portion of the fund to support the 9 mediation of condominium related disputes will benefit 10 condominium owners and associations.

11 The purpose of this Act is to specify that a percentage of 12 fees paid into the condominium education trust fund shall be 13 used to support mediation of condominium related disputes.

14 SECTION 2. Section 514B-71, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 15 amended to read as follows:

16 "[+]\$514B-71[+] Condominium education trust fund. (a)
17 The commission shall establish a condominium education trust
18 fund that the commission [may]:
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1	<u>(1)</u>	May use for educational purposes[. Educational
2		purposes], which shall include financing or promoting:
3	[(1)]	(A) Education and research in the field of
4		condominium management, condominium project
5		registration, and real estate, for the benefit of
6		the public and those required to be registered

8	[-(2)-]	(B) The improvement and more efficient administration
9		of associations; and
10	[(3)]	(C) Expeditious and inexpensive procedures for
11		resolving association disputes [-]; and
12	(2)	Shall use to support mediation of condominium-related
13		disputes; provided that an amount equal to \$
14		multiplied by the number of registered condominium
15		units in Hawaii per year shall be allocated annually
16		for the payment of mediation services for the benefit
17		of condominium owners and associations in condominium-
18	·	related disputes.
19	(b)	The commission [may] shall use any and all moneys in
20	the condor	minium education trust fund for purposes consistent
21	with subse	ection (a)."

1 SECTION 3. Section 514B-72, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 3 "(a) Each project or association with more than five 4 units, including any project or association with more than five 5 units subject to chapter 514A, shall pay to the department of 6 commerce and consumer affairs a condominium education trust fund 7 fee within one year after the recordation of the purchase of the 8 first unit or within thirty days of the association's first 9 meeting, and thereafter, on or before June 30 of every odd-10 numbered year [, as prescribed by rules adopted pursuant to 11 chapter 91]. The fee shall be an amount equal to \$ per 12 registered condominium unit to support the mediation of 13 condominium-related disputes, pursuant to section 514B-71(a); 14 provided that the fee may be increased by rules adopted pursuant 15 to chapter 91." 16 SECTION 4. Until the real estate commission adopts rules 17 pursuant to chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes, establishing 18 the amount of the condominium education trust fund fee pursuant 19 to section 514B-72, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the amount of the
