### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NATIVE HAWAIIANS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 In Act 195, Session Laws of Hawaii 2011, the SECTION 1. 2 legislature recognized the Native Hawaiian people as the only 3 indigenous, aboriginal, maoli people of Hawaii. Act 195 also 4 provided for the recognition of the Native Hawaiian people by 5 means and methods that would facilitate their self-governance, including the establishment of, or amendment to, programs, 6 7 entities, and other matters pursuant to law that relate to or 8 affect ownership, possession, or use of lands by the Native 9 Hawaiian people, and by further promoting their culture, 10 heritage, entitlements, health, education, and welfare.

11 To begin the process of recognition, Act 195 established a 12 five-member roll commission whose purpose, in part, is to 13 certify individuals on the roll of qualified Native Hawaiians. A qualified Native Hawaiian must be, among other requirements, 14 15 someone who is a descendant of the aboriginal peoples who, prior to 1778, occupied and exercised sovereignty in the Hawaiian 16 17 islands; or someone who is one of the indigenous, native people 18 of Hawaii and was eligible in 1921 for the programs authorized HB HMS 2013-1380



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by the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act, 1920, or a direct lineal
 descendant of that individual. A qualified Native Hawaiian must
 also be eighteen years of age or older.

In order to meet the requirements for certification as a
qualified Native Hawaiian, it is often necessary for an
individual to produce birth, marriage, divorce, or death
certificates, certified by the department of health. These
certificates currently cost \$10 for the first copy and \$4 for
each additional copy.

10 The purpose of this Act is to establish a fee of \$1, which 11 shall be deposited into the state general fund, for certified 12 copies of birth, marriage, divorce, or death certificates that 13 are required to prove that an individual is a qualified Native 14 Hawaiian.

15 SECTION 2. Section 338-14.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 16 amended to read as follows:

17 "§338-14.5 Copies of certificate; fees. (a) The fees for
18 certified copies of birth, marriage, divorce, or death
19 certificates issued by the department of health shall consist of
20 \$10 for the first copy issued and \$4 for each copy issued
21 thereafter. These fees shall be collected for each single
22 request for certified copies.

20	<u>(c)</u>	The fee for a certified copy of a birth, marriage,	
21	divorce,	or death certificate issued by the department of health	
22	<u>shall be</u>	\$1 for each certified copy when the certified copy is	



1	required as proof that an individual is a qualified Native
2	Hawaiian pursuant to section 10H-3. The director of health
3	shall deposit moneys collected under this subsection into the
4	general fund."
5	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
6	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
7	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

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**Report Title:** Native Hawaiians; Certified Copies; Fees
