A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO YOUTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii is one of the 2 safest and healthiest places in the nation for children and 3 youth. However, many of Hawaii's youth are not immune to daily 4 threats to their health and safety. Every year, youth run away 5 from homes where abuse, neglect, and domestic violence are 6 commonplace, or from schools where intolerable bullying becomes a major barrier to educational achievement. Without access to 7 8 safe places, youth in these situations are vulnerable and may be victimized by predatory adults who lure them into alcohol and 9 substance abuse or prostitution. 10

In October 2012, these concerns were discussed during the 11 12 annual children and youth summit sponsored by the legislature's 13 keiki caucus. In these discussions, youth expressed concerns 14 over a lack of safe places. Youth were interested in accessing 15 places where they could seek safety from intolerable home or school environments without fear of being judged, detained, or 16 17 criminalized as a runaway. 1	programs, and services, including guidance and counseling for		
2	suicide prevention, teen pregnancy prevention, tobacco		
3	cessation, and alcohol and substance abuse support. Finally,		
4	youth wished to access safe places where they could have fun		
5	without the fear of being harassed, bullied, or pressured by		
6	other youth or adults. At the end of the summit, participating		
7	youth identified the need for safe places as one of their		
8	highest priorities.		
9	Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to:		
10	(1) Require the office of youth services to coordinate a		
11	two-year safe places for youth pilot program, which		
12	will coordinate a network of safe places where youth		
13	can access safety and obtain advice, guidance,		
14	programs, and services; and		
15	(2) Establish and fund the position of safe places for		
16	youth program coordinator.		
17	SECTION 2. (a) The office of youth services shall		
18	coordinate a safe places for youth pilot program in partnership		
19	with private organizations. The primary objective of the pilot		
20	program shall be to coordinate a network that youth may access		
21	for safety and may obtain advice, guidance, programs, and		

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1	services.	All youth are eligible for services at the safe	
2	places.		
3	(b)	There is established the position of safe places for	
4	youth program coordinator. The coordinator shall:		
5	(1)	Coordinate the safe places for youth network;	
6	(2)	Partner with an entity to maintain an updated listing	
.7		of safe places statewide;	
8	(3)	Provide ongoing training of organizations designated	
9		as safe places for youth in areas including emergency	
10		response and trauma;	
11	(4)	Partner with the department of education, Hawaii state	
12		student council, peer education programs, private	
13		schools, and other youth services organizations to	
14		build awareness of the safe places for youth network;	
15		and	
16	(5)	Convene an annual meeting of safe places for youth	
17		organizations and other interested parties to identify	
18		emerging needs, provide feedback on program	
19		effectiveness, and provide an opportunity to recommend	
20		improvements to the pilot program.	

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1	(c)	The safe places for youth pilot program shall provide	
2	access to	and linkage with services and programs needed by	
3	youth, ind	cluding but not limited to:	
4	(1)	Domestic violence prevention or reduction;	
5	(2)	Violence and trauma recovery and support;	
6	(3)	Human trafficking resources and prevention;	
7	(4)	Suicide prevention;	
8	(5)	Resources targeted at teenagers, including teen	
9		pregnancy prevention;	
10	(6)	Tobacco cessation;	
11	(7)	Alcohol and substance abuse support;	
12	(8)	Assistance for youth to achieve their educational and	
13		vocational goals; and	
14	(9)	Other relationship building and life skills.	
15	(d)	The office of youth services shall coordinate a	
16	comprehens	sive network of safe places for youth to assist youth	
17	in obtain:	ing the advice and guidance they need.	
18	(e)	The safe places for youth pilot program shall cease to	
19	exist on a	June 30, 2015.	
20	(f)	For the purposes of this section:	
21	"Safe	e places" means physical and virtual places of safety	
22	for youth.		
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"Youth" means any person twenty-one years of age or
younger.

SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 3 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$250,000 or so much 5 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2013-2014 and the 6 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 7 2014-2015 for the position of safe places for youth program 8 coordinator and for residential options for the pilot program. 9 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department of human services office of youth services for the purposes of 10 11 this Act.

12 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2013.

Report Title:

Keiki Caucus; Office of Youth Services; Safe Places for Youth Pilot Program; Safe Places for Youth Program Coordinator; Appropriation

Description:

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Requires the office of youth services to coordinate a two-year safe places for youth pilot program, which will coordinate a network of safe places where youth can access safety and obtain advice, guidance, programs, and services. Establishes the position of safe places for youth program coordinator. Appropriates funds for the coordinator position and residential options for the pilot program.

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
