## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC HOUSING.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that many public housing 2 projects and state low-income housing projects currently allow 3 and have installed clotheslines where there is adequate space 4 and where appropriate. However, not all of these projects allow 5 the installation of clotheslines. The legislature believes that 6 the cost-efficiencies and environmental benefits of permitting 7 clotheslines in all public housing projects and state low-income housing projects merit consideration. 8 9 The purpose of this Act is to require the Hawaii public 10 housing authority, in conjunction with the United States 11 Department of Housing and Urban Development, to conduct a study **12** on the feasibility of permitting the installation of 13 clotheslines in all public housing projects and state low-income 14 housing projects in the State. 15 SECTION 2.
