### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII HEALTH SYSTEMS CORPORATION.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State faces a
severe shortage of healthcare providers. This situation is
particularly acute in primary care, where most of the
prevention, early intervention, and healthcare cost savings
occur.

6 The legislature further finds that the Hawaii health 7 systems corporation primary care training program is an 8 effective way to reduce the impact of the shortage of primary 9 care providers and improve access to healthcare throughout the 10 State. Administered by Hilo medical center in coordination with 11 the Hawaii health systems corporation regions, this 12 interdisciplinary program includes: the Hawaii island family medicine residency program, training for advanced practice 13 14 nurses from the school of nursing and dental hygiene at the 15 University of Hawaii at Manoa and the school of nursing at the 16 University of Hawaii at Hilo, clinical pharmacists from the 17 University of Hawaii at Hilo's college of pharmacy, and post-

2 psychologists to meet the needs of residents of rural areas. 3 The success of this training model, which will be expanded 4 to neighbor island health facilities, will generate 5 interdisciplinary teams capable of caring for four times as many 6 patients as independent practicing physicians. Hawaii will 7 benefit greatly as the Hawaii health systems corporation 8 regions' program will eliminate the need to train or attract 9 unattainably high numbers of physicians. 10 The purpose of this Act is to address the shortage of 11 primary care providers in the State by appropriating funds for the interdisciplinary Hawaii health systems corporation primary 12 13 care training program at Hilo medical center. 14 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 15 or so much 16 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2013-2014 and the 17 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 18 2014-2015 for the interdisciplinary Hawaii health systems 19 corporation primary care training program at Hilo medical 20 center.
