## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE FOUNDATION ON CULTURE AND ARTS.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 During the recent economic downturn and recession, the
- 2 State was forced to trim costs in order to meet the most basic
- 3 needs of its residents. Many state agencies, including the
- 4 state foundation on culture and the arts, needed to make
- 5 difficult decisions in scaling back operations so that each
- 6 agency could contribute its share of general funds to meet the
- 7 demands of a balanced budget.
- 8 In 2010, the state foundation on culture and the arts lost
- 9 more than one third of their staff, a total of eleven positions,
- 10 as well as all general fund appropriations for salary support.
- 11 This year, the state foundation on culture and the arts also
- 12 stands to lose an additional eight per cent in federal funds,
- 13 bringing the decrease in their federal funding to \$100,000 in
- 14 two years.
- 15 The legislature finds that the state foundation on culture
- 16 and the arts is an important state resource that provides
- 17 numerous projects and programs to support the arts and cultural
- 18 life of Hawaii's communities. Some of these projects and HB459 HD1 HMS 2013-1855



- 1 programs include the artists in the schools program, which
- 2 brings a professional artist into the classroom to support
- 3 subjects upheld by educational curriculum standards; a cultural
- 4 project to preserve the art of kapa-making that is conducted in
- 5 partnership with both public and private organizations; and the
- 6 biennium grants program which provides support for community
- 7 projects and grass roots organizations throughout our islands
- 8 through grants in heritage and preservation, presentation and
- 9 the performing arts, and arts education. Over time, the loss of
- 10 these types of projects and programs would result in a loss of
- 11 cultural resources, knowledge, and skill that can never be
- 12 replaced. Thus, support for the arts and cultural life of
- 13 Hawaii's communities must continue.
- 14 The purpose of this Act is to provide general fund
- 15 appropriations to the state foundation on culture and the arts
- 16 to continue to promote and preserve culture and the arts in
- 17 Hawaii.
- 18 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 19 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 20 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2013-2014 and the
- 21 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 22 2014-2015 for the following purposes:
