A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH BENEFITS TRUST FUND.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to convene a task		
2	force in the department of budget and finance to examine the		
3	unfunded liability of the Hawaii employer-union health benefits		
4	trust fund.		
5	SECTION 2. (a) There is established a Hawaii employer-		
6	union health benefits trust fund task force within the		
7	department of budget and finance for administrative purposes to		
8	consist of the following members:		
9	(1) Two members from the house of representatives selected		
10	by the speaker of the house of representatives;		
11	(2) Two members from the senate selected by the senate		
12	president;		
13	(3) Four members representing the State's unions;		
14	(4) One member representing public employee retirees;		
15	(5) The director of finance, or the director's designee;		
16	(6) One member from the Hawaii Council of Mayors; and		

1	(7) One member from the Hawaii State Association of
2	Counties.
3	The director of finance, or the director's designee, shall
4	serve as the chairperson of the task force. The task force
5	shall cease to exist on June 30, 2014.
6	(b) The members of the task force shall serve without
7	compensation, but shall be reimbursed for expenses, including
8	travel expenses, necessary for the performance of their duties.
9	No member shall be made subject to chapter 84, Hawaii Revised
10	Statutes, solely because of that member's participation as a
11	member of that task force.
12	SECTION 3. The Hawaii employer-union health benefits trust
13	fund task force shall examine the unfunded liability of the
14	Hawaii employer-union health benefits trust fund, including:
15	(1) The current and projected unfunded actuarial accrued
16	liability of the Hawaii employer-union health benefits
17	trust fund;
18	(2) The availability of medical benefits plans other than
19	plans that pay or reimburse medical services providers
20	under a fee-for-service model; provided that the task
21	force shall explore alternative medical benefits
22	plans;

1	(3)	The costs and benefits of alternative medical benefits	
2		plans in relation to the medical benefits plans	
3		currently offered by the trust fund;	
4	(4)	An evaluation of the costs and process of	
5		transitioning from the current medical benefits plans	
6		to an alternative medical benefits plan, including	
7		recommended proposed legislation; and	
8	(5)	Any other matters that are relevant to gaining a full	
9		and meaningful understanding of the circumstance of	
10		the trust fund.	
11	SECT	ION 4. The director of finance, in consultation with	
12	the task force, shall submit a report to the legislature,		
13	including	findings, recommendations, and implementing draft	
14	legislation, no later than twenty days prior to the convening o		
15	the regular session of 2014.		
16	SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general		
17	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so	
18	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2013-2014 to		
19	support the work of the Hawaii employer-union health benefits		
20	trust fun	d task force, including necessary travel expenses for	
21	task force members who reside outside of Oahu and consulting		
22	services of persons knowledgeable in relevant issues.
