A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that peer education
2	programs in secondary schools provide positive health and safety
3	benefits for students; however not all of Hawaii's public
4	secondary schools have peer education programs.
5	Generally, schools with peer education programs report a
6	downward trend in:
7	(1) The number of students carrying weapons on campus;
8	(2) Physical fighting on campus;
9	(3) The number of students who have planned suicide; and
10	(4) The number of students who drink and use marijuana on
11	school property.
12	In addition, data shows that peer education programs have
13	contributed to improvements in adolescent health, such as low
14	incidences of students testing positive for sexually transmitted
15	diseases and a decrease in teenage pregnancy rates.
16	The purpose of this Act is to make an appropriation to the
17	department of education to establish peer education programs in
18	all of Hawaii's public secondary schools.
