BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Chapter 712, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
2	amended b	y adding a new section to part V to be appropriately	
3	designate	d and to read as follows:	
4	" <u>§7</u> 1	2- Feeding of wild or feral birds; penalty. (1) A	
5	person co	mmits the offense of feeding a wild or feral bird if	
6	the perso	n knowingly feeds a wild or feral bird.	
7	(2)	A person who commits the offense of feeding a wild or	
8	feral bird shall be guilty:		
9	<u>(a)</u>	For a first offense, of a violation.	
10	<u>(b)</u>	For a second and subsequent offense, of a petty	
11		misdemeanor.	
12	(3)	This section shall not apply to:	
13	<u>(a)</u>	Any animal control officer, duly incorporated humane	
14		society, or duly authorized governmental agency	
15		feeding wild or feral birds OvoControl or any other	
16		avian reproductive control product in accordance with	
17		accepted animal control practices and any state or	
18		federal law; or	

1	<u>(b)</u>	Employees or authorized agents of county, state, or
2		federal agencies who are carrying out activities
3		required under a management plan approved by county,
4		state, or federal agencies pursuant to a mandatory
5		statutory duty for the protection of species listed as
6		threatened or endangered species and other wildlife
7		species protected by law.
8	(4)	As used in this section:
9	<u>"Wil</u>	d or feral bird" means any non-domesticated avian,
10	including	pigeons; provided that "wild or feral bird" shall not
11	include chickens."	
12	SECT	ION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
13	matured,	penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
14	begun bef	ore its effective date.
15	SECT	ION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
16	SECT	ION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
