A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PHARMACY BENEFITS MANAGERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 The legislature finds that numerous states have enacted or 2 are considering legislation to regulate pharmacy benefit 3 managers. Pharmacy benefit managers are intermediaries that negotiate services and costs between pharmaceutical companies 4 and third party payors, such as insurance companies, businesses, 5 6 and cash-paying customers. Pharmacy benefits managers manage 7 all aspects of a prescription drug benefit plan, from 8 establishing formularies of preferred drugs, negotiations with drug manufacturers and pharmacies, to ownership of their own 9 10 mail order pharmacy to directly fill prescriptions. 11 largest pharmacy benefit managers administer prescription drug benefits for approximately eighty per cent of insured 12 prescriptions and ninety per cent of insured mail order 13 14 prescriptions. 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- pharmacy benefits managers to influence patient behavior in a
 manner that drives business to the pharmacy benefits managers'
- 3 own subsidiary pharmacies. Such a practice would appear to be
- 4 unfair and deceptive since the patient often does not know that
- 5 the patient's claim information is being used in this manner and
- 6 that the pharmacy network being advertised is affiliated with or
- 7 owned by the pharmacy benefits manager.
- 8 The purpose of this Act is to prohibit pharmacy benefits
- 9 managers from using a patient's claim information to market or
- 10 advertise to that patient the services of a preferred pharmacy
- 11 network that is owned by the pharmacy benefits manager.
- 12 SECTION 2. Chapter 481B, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 13 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 14 and to read as follows:
- 15 "\$481B- Pharmacy benefits managers, prohibited
- 16 marketing practices. (a) A pharmacy benefit management company
- 17 shall take no action that would restrict a patient's choice of
- 18 pharmacy from which to receive prescription drug benefits,
- 19 including:
- 20 (1) Use of an individual's prior prescription drug
- 21 benefits claim information; or
