A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTI	ON 1. The Hawaii State Planning Act, chapter 226,	
2	Hawaii Rev	rised Statutes, asserts that it shall be the policy of	
3	the State	to promote economically competitive activities that	
4	increase H	awaii's agricultural self-sufficiency, attractiveness,	
5	and opport	cunities for an agricultural workforce and livelihood.	
6	The l	egislature finds that to ensure Hawaii's agricultural	
7	self-suffi	ciency, it is critical to create a workforce	
8	development plan that will:		
9	(1)	Introduce Hawaii's youth to agriculture-related	
10		activities that will promote an interest and aptitude	
11		in agricultural sustainability;	
12	(2)	Engage in an ongoing effort to promote the development	
13		of future leaders in the agricultural sector who will	
14		have a vision for the future of Hawaii in all sectors	
15		of the agriculture industry and its related fields;	
16	(3)	Identify available opportunities for future workforce	
17		participants to engage in and further their training	

1		to prepare to become members of the agricultural
2		workforce; and
3	(4)	Develop a seamless Hawaii P-20 program to transition
4		future agricultural workforce participants into the
5		workforce.
6	SECT:	ION 2. (a) There is created the Hawaii agriculture
7	workforce	advisory board, which shall include the following
8	members o	r their designees:
9	(1)	The director of labor and industrial relations;
10	(2)	The chairperson of the board of agriculture;
11	(3)	The superintendent of the department of education;
12	(4)	The dean of the college of tropical agriculture and
13		human resources at the University of Hawaii at Manoa;
14	(5)	The dean of the college of agriculture, forestry and
15		natural resource management at the University of
16		Hawaii at Hilo;
17	(6)	A chancellor of a community college within the
18		University of Hawaii system, selected by the other
19		members of the advisory board;
20	(7)	A representative from the Hawaii Farm Bureau
21		Rodoration, and

1	(8)	A representative from the farming community to be
2		selected by the chairperson of the board of
3		agriculture.
4	The direc	tor of labor and industrial relations shall serve as
5	the chair	person of the advisory board.
6	(b)	The advisory board shall be responsible for:
7	(1)	Developing the next generation of the agriculture
8		industry workforce in the State;
9	(2)	The mission, direction, and goals of the advisory
10		board;
11	(3)	Developing partnerships with agricultural
12		organizations and stakeholders to further the advisory
13		board's mission and objectives;
14	(4)	Maintaining and supporting the National FFA
15		Organization within the State; and
16	(5)	Recommending projects and programs to promote the
17		expansion and development of the agricultural industry
18		in the State.
19	SECT	TION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
20	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
21	thereof a	as may be necessary for fiscal year 2013-2014 and the
22	same sum	or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
